

Linking to AL Using Key Numbers

Key numbers give you quick access to tutorials. They can be used to search for particular tutorials or used on Web pages or in e-mails to directly link to tutorials.

Search for a particular tutorial by entering the Key Number in the search box.

- If you want someone to view a particular tutorial, give them the key number of that tutorial and tell them to search on the key Number.
- If you are given the key number of a tutorial, just enter that number in the search box and click Go!

Create direct links to tutorials in an e-mail, on a Web page or in your Learning Management System (such as Blackboard, D2L, Moodle, or WebCT).

- The URL for the direct link to a movie uses a special format.
- The only thing that changes in the link is the Key Number.
- Key Numbers are listed to the right of the tutorial title.
- When creating a link to a tutorial, use the following format for the URL:

For QuickTime:

<http://www.atomiclearning.com/almovie?key=xxxx>
(xxxx is the movie's Key Number)

Examples:

If the movie's Key Number = 12304, the URL would be
<http://www.atomiclearning.com/almovie?key=12304>

If the movie's Key Number = 17891, the URL would be
<http://www.atomiclearning.com/almovie?key=17891>

For Flash:

<http://www.atomiclearning.com/almovie?key=xxxx&format=1>
(xxxx is the movie's Key Number)

Examples:

If the movie's Key Number = 12304, the URL would be
<http://www.atomiclearning.com/almovie?key=12304&format=1>

If the movie's Key Number = 17891, the URL would be
<http://www.atomiclearning.com/almovie?key=17891&format=1>

Note: Viewers will need to be logged in to view the tutorials. If they are not already logged in, they will get a log-in screen before the movie is displayed.
