Using iannotate to Peer Edit &
Revise Research Papers

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Grammar 7 & 8 Honors

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OBJECTIVES

- Students will access, email, and open their research papers using the ipads.
- Students will use iannotate to complete a “research paper scavenger hunt.”
- Students will use iannotate to peer edit/revise a research paper.
- Students will assess each others’ research paper, looking for proper structure, conventions, word choice, fluency, and ideas - especially relating to literature response style writing.
- Students will assess the peer-writer’s evaluation of the novel/poem, literary elements, and example used to prove the theme.
- Students will share their assessments with the original writer and the teacher.

DIRECTIONS

SETTING IT ALL UP

1. Using the iPad, open Google Apps. Log in with your own email address.
2. Go to the bottom of the screen and select "Desktop". Choose "continue to desktop version".
3. Find your research paper document (should be starred already). Put a check in the box next to it.
4. Go to "Share". Select "email as an attachment". Attach item as "pdf".
5. Send to plib.ipad@student.ahschool.com
6. Press power button to exit, and open MAIL app (looks like an envelope). Select "inbox" and open the email from classmate.
7. Double-tap the pdf attachment to open it.
8. In the upper-right corner, tap the forward button (looks like a box with an arrow).
9. Select "open in..." and choose "iAnnotate".

Your classmate's research paper will open in iAnnotate. Now you have to set up a toolbar so that you can complete the RESEARCH PAPER SCAVENGER HUNT.

To set up the toolbar:

1. Tap the wrench in the upper-right corner of the screen.
2. Tap the green plus symbol in the bottom-right corner of the screen. This means you will add a new toolbar.
3. Select "New Custom Toolbar"
4. Scroll up to find "Highlight of a specific color". DO NOT TAP THAT ICON, instead, DRAG it down to the black icon at the bottom of the screen. Tap red.
5. Again, DRAG the "highlight of a specific color" icon down next to the red highlighter in the bottom of the screen. Tap orange.
6. Continue DRAGGING the icon and selecting colors until you have selected pink (6 more times).
7. Tap the "done" button on the bottom left, then tap the golden check mark in the bottom left. Drag your completed highlighter toolbar to the top of the screen.

You are now ready to complete the scavenger hunt.

DIRECTIONS-

SCAVENGER HUNT

1. Using the colored highlighters toolbar that you've just created, locate and highlight/underline each of the following:

- HOOK - AQUA
- BACKGROUND INFO - ORANGE
- THESIS STATEMENT - YELLOW
 - Use the underline icon (ABC) to underline each literary element listed in the thesis statement. Do not underline unimportant words.
- TOPIC SENTENCE (literary element) #1 - GREEN
 - Use the underline icon to underline just the literary element within **each** topic sentence.
 - Count the number of supporting detail sentences for this paragraph. If there are more than 3, use the stamp icon to put a green "thumbs up" stamp next to that paragraph. If there are fewer than 3, put a green "thumbs down".
- TOPIC SENTENCE (literary element) #2 - GREEN
 - If there are more than 3 supporting detail sentences, put a green thumbs up stamp. Fewer than 3, put a green thumbs down.
- TOPIC SENTENCE (literary element) #3 - GREEN
 - If there are more than 3 supporting detail sentences, put a green thumbs up stamp. Fewer than 3, put a green thumbs down.
- RESTATED THESIS - YELLOW
- GENERAL INFORMATION - ORANGE
- CLOSING COMMENTS - AQUA

2. Re-read the supporting details within each body paragraph. If you think they are relevant, include at least one quote, and really explain how the literary element shows the theme, use the stamp icon to give the paragraph a YELLOW STAR. If you think the supporting details are not relevant, confusing, or just don't really show how the literary element is used to show the theme, then put a YELLOW FROWN.
3. Decide what your overall impression of the paper is. Do you think it's really great? Do you think it's not really on topic, or doesn't make sense? You decide. At this time, DO NOT CONSIDER grammar, spelling, or punctuation in your assessment. You are only looking to see if the writing itself is good, not the conventions. Use the stamp icon, and choose one that best expresses your evaluation. Place that stamp on the very top of the paper.
4. At the top of the screen, choose the forwarding icon (box with an arrow). Select "mail document". Tap "flattened" the middle option. Send the email back to plib.ipad@student.ahschool.com (The # you received it from). In the Cc/Bcc: line, type sari.weltmann@ahschool.com, and tap "send".

You have completed the scavenger hunt!!! CONGRATUATIONS!!

DIRECTIONS - EDITING

Once you have completed highlighted and assessing the writing of a paper, and have emailed it back to its owner and Mrs. Weltmann, you will edit the same paper for conventions (grammar, spelling, punctuation, capitalization).

1. Open the Mail app on the home screen. From the inbox, open the email sent to you yesterday.
2. Open the pdf attachment, and open it with iannotate (similar to yesterday, but a fresh copy will appear).
3. Using iannotate, use the pencil icon to mark up the paper. You can do it in red, or another color of your choice. You will use the tip of your finger, or fingernail to draw directly on the screen. Make sure you use the correct editor's symbols (ex: 3 underlines to capitalize). All editing symbols **MUST** be done **BENEATH** the line, not above it.
4. Using a different pencil color, write in comments where you feel necessary. Ex: WC - word choice.
5. Using the stamp icon, give the MLA heading an "approved" stamp if it is totally correct.
6. Using the stamp icon, give the paper a grade for the conventions only.
7. Email the pdf "flattened" back to its owner and cc Mrs. Weltmann

WOOHOO!!!! YOU DID IT!!!! Now, you get to play!!!

DIRECTIONS - JUST FOR FUN!

1. Go to the home screen, and open PK K apps.
2. Select "CookieDoodle". Have FUN! Make a cookie that you feel best represents the paper you graded.
3. Email your completed cookie picture to the ipad user who's paper you graded. CC Mrs. Weltmann.
