- Not so much a RELIGION, as an ALL ENCOMPASSING WAY OF LIFE
- The World's OLDEST organized religion
 - Made up of 1,000s of different groups
- Hinduism dates as far back as the Harappan River Valley Civilization (up to 5500 Years ago!)
- Today, Hinduism is the world's THIRD LARGEST RELIGION (just under 1 BILLION people)

 - When you die, your soul returns in a different form
- KARMA

 - **Ramayana**- Epic poem from India
- **Caste System** 

India's Traditional Corporate Ladder

Rooted in Hinduism, India's complex caste system includes 3,000 castes and 25,000 sub-castes, all traditionally related to occupation. They fall under four basic “varnas” or categories:

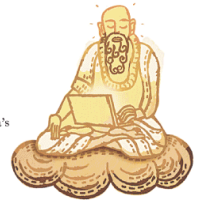
BRAHMINS:

Priests, scholars and teachers.

Famous members include:

Jawaharlal Nehru: First prime minister of independent India

Rahul Dravid: captain of India's cricket team



KSHATRIYAS:

Warriors and rulers

Famous members include:

Vasundhara Raje Scindia, chief minister of the Indian state of Rajasthan



VAISHYAS:

Traders

Famous members include:

Lakshmi Mittal: chief executive, Arcelor Mittal steel company

Mohandas Gandhi: Independence leader, the “father of the nation”



SUDRAS:

Manual workers and servants



DALITS:

Formerly known as “Untouchables,” Dalits perform unpleasant jobs like cleaning or leather tanning. With changes in India, some Dalits are now becoming entrepreneurs or getting jobs in high-tech.

Famous members include:

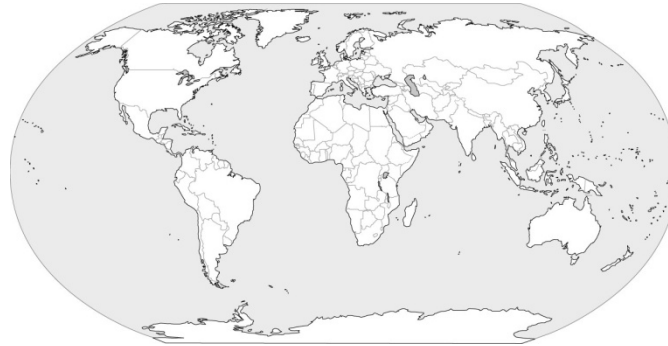
KR Narayanan: Former President of India

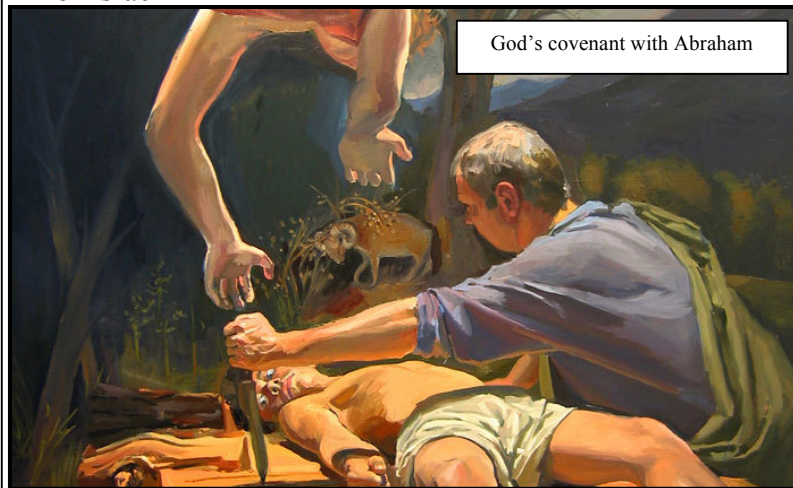
- World's oldest surviving monotheistic religion
 - Abraham father of the Jewish people lived around 2,000 BCE
- God told Abraham to sacrifice his son Isaac
 - God sent an angel to stop him just before Abraham sacrificed Isaac (below)
- For his faith, God stated that Isaac would inherit the land of Israel

MOSES & THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

- Moses frees the Hebrews from enslavement in Egypt and leads them to Mt. Sinai where God gave Moses the 10 Commandments

TORAH (1st Five Books of the Old Testament)

- Foundation of Jewish legal & ethical texts
- Kept on a scroll of parchment

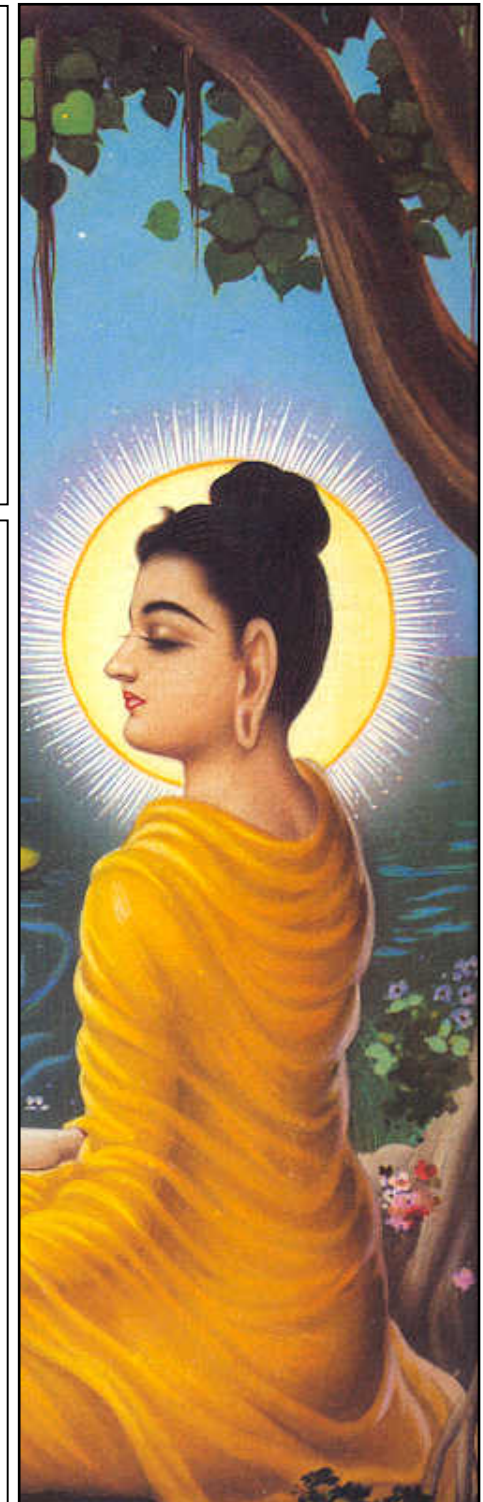
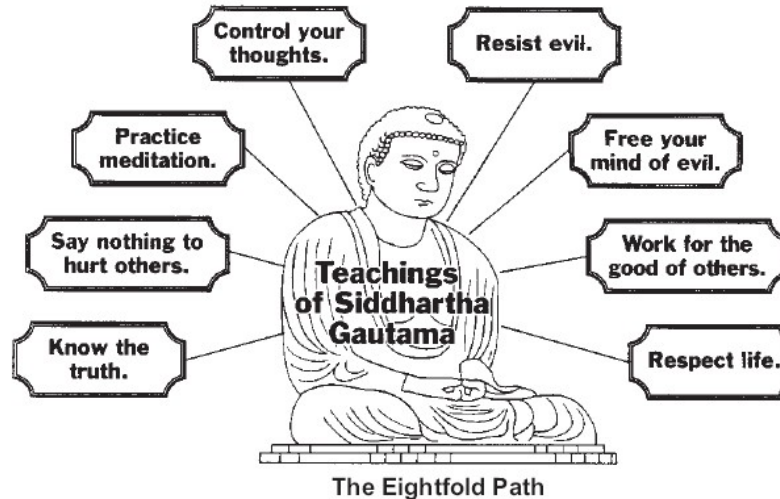

-Third Noble Truth: Dhammacakkappavattana Sutta, Buddha's first discourse after he achieved Nirvana

Four Noble Truths

- 1** Life means suffering
- 2** Origin of Suffering is attachment (desire)
- 3** Cessation of suffering comes from the ending of desire
- 4** End desire by following the 8-fold Path

- Considered to be the world's 4th largest religion
- Founded by Siddhartha Gautama
 - Indian Prince who lived around 500 BCE
 - Left his sheltered life to try to find an end to suffering
 - Became the Enlightened One... The Buddha
- No concept of God
- GOAL=NIRVANA (End of want/desire/reincarnation)

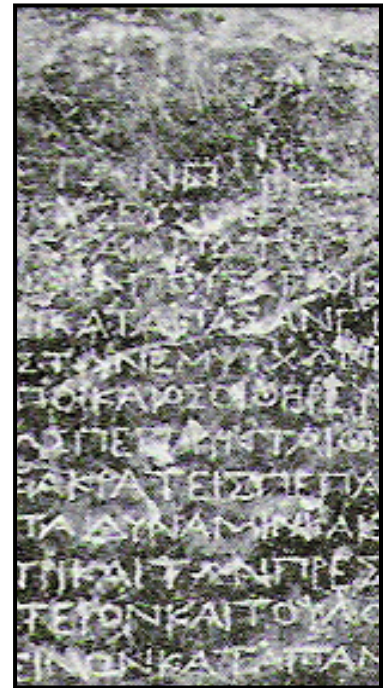

"Everywhere has Beloved-of-the-Gods, King Piyadasi (Asoka), made provision for two types of medical treatment: medical treatment for humans and medical treatment for animals. Wherever medical herbs suitable for humans or animals are not available, I have had them imported and grown. Wherever medical roots or fruits are not available I have had them imported and grown. Along roads I have had wells dug and trees planted for the benefit of humans and animals."

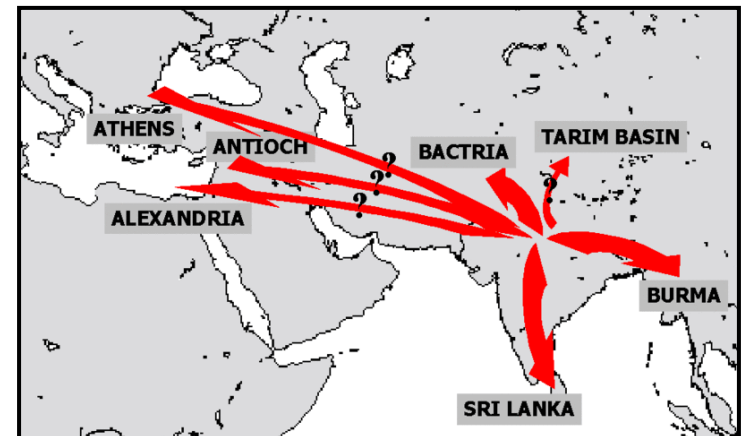
"Beloved-of-the-Gods, King Piyadasi, desires that all religions should reside everywhere, for all of them desire self-control and purity of heart. But people have various desires and various passions, and they may practice all of what they should or only a part of it. But one who receives great gifts yet is lacking in self-control, purity of heart, gratitude and firm devotion, such a person is mean."

"Beloved-of-the-Gods, King Piyadasi, conquered the Kalingas eight years after his coronation. One hundred and fifty thousand were deported, one hundred thousand were killed and many more died (from other causes). After the Kalingas had been conquered, Beloved-of-the-Gods came to feel a strong inclination towards the Dhamma (Buddhism), a love for the Dhamma and for instruction in Dhamma. Now Beloved-of-the-Gods feels deep remorse for having conquered the Kalingas."

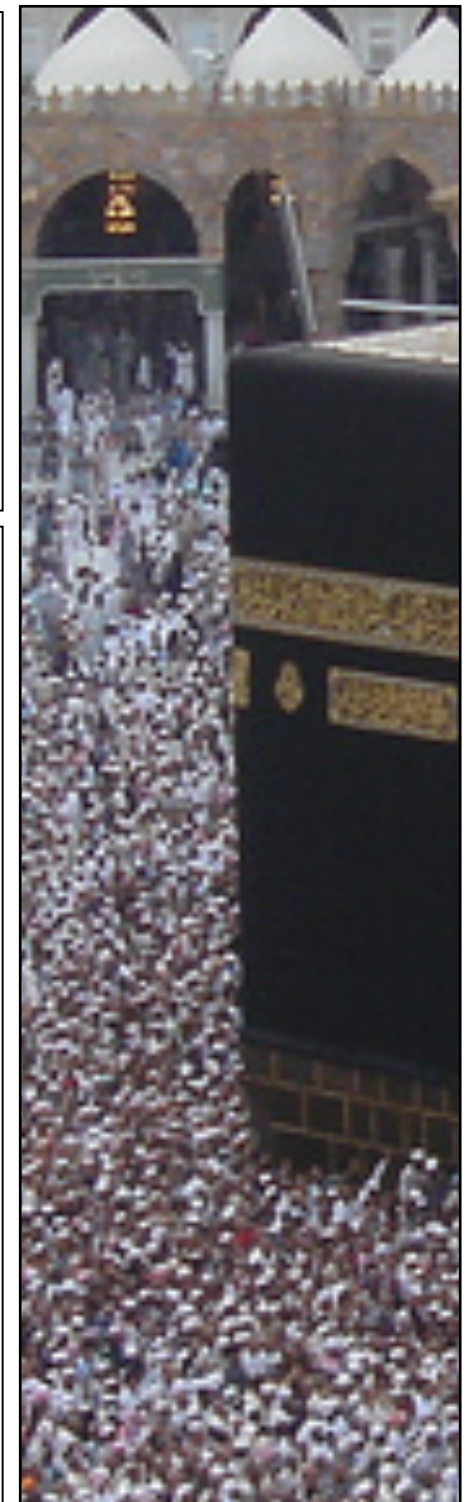
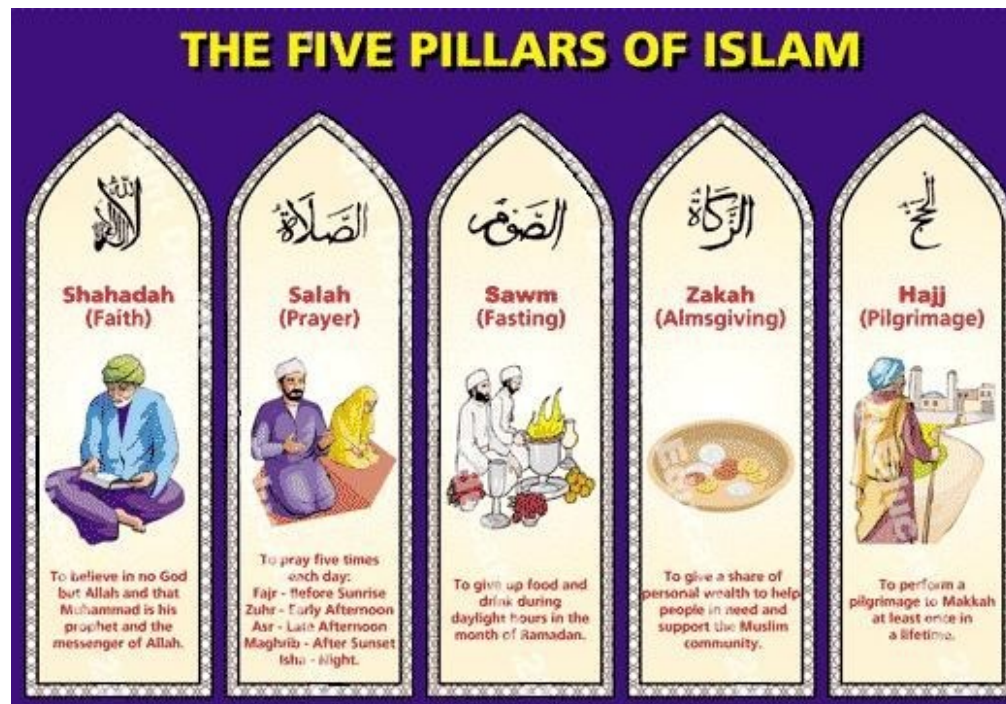
- World's Largest Religion (2 billion or 1/3 of Earth)
- Nearly 30,000 sects all with different beliefs
 - From Catholics to Mormons
- Yeshua of Nazareth
 - Jewish carpenter born between 6-4 BCE
 - Known by the Greek form of his name as Jesus
 - Christians believe him to be the son of god
 - Jesus was crucified by the Romans for claiming to be the son of god
 - Christians believe that after his death he came back to life
- Holy Book= Bible (Old + New Testament)
- After you die...
 - Good Christian believers go to Heaven
 - Bad Sinners go to Hell
 - Catholics believe in Purgatory
 - Temporary place of punishment
- After Jesus & his Apostles died...
 - Early Christian leaders met in Councils to determine the future of the faith (Bible? Leaders? Etc.)

- Islam is the 2nd largest religion (1.6 Billion or ¼)
 - Fastest growing religion
- Islam was revealed to the Prophet Muhammad in 610 CE
 - Muhammad is not seen as anything more than a Prophet
 - Muhammad restored the one true faith of Adam, Noah, Abraham, Moses, & Jesus
- Upset with his Meccan life, he retreated to a cave to meditate...
 - Angel Gabriel appeared and revealed the Qu’ran (“A recitation”)
- God=Allah (Arabic for “god”)
- Holy Cities
 - Mecca & Medina

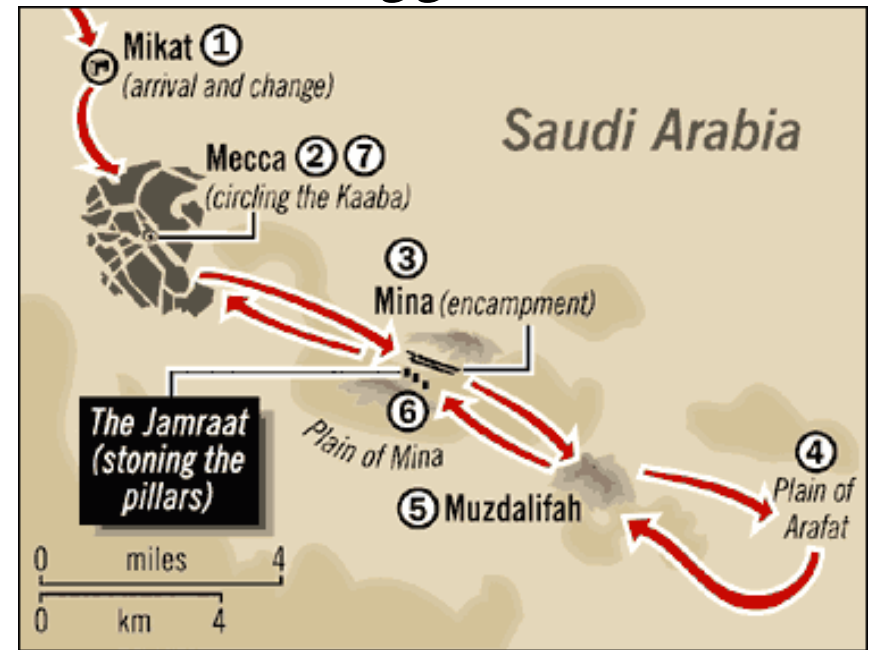

The Hajj

One of the best known "Pillars", the Hajj is the pilgrimage Muslims must make to Mecca at least once in their lifetimes (if they can afford it).



The Hajj is the largest pilgrimage on the planet. It serves a symbol of submission to Allah and solidarity with their fellow Muslims. Below are the steps the pilgrims take while on the Hajj.



- 1 Pilgrims must enter into the state of Imrah where they clean themselves and wear Imrah garments.
- 2 From there, the pilgrims travel to Mecca and circle the Ka'aba 7 times (keeping the Ka'aba on your left). You then trim your hair and remove your Imrah garments.
- 3 Then, they put the Imrah garments on again and head to Mina for prayer and preparation for travel.
- 4 After sunrise, they head out to the Mount Arafat where they pray for forgiveness to Allah
- 5 Another stop for prayer.
- 6 After collecting 7 pebbles, pilgrims throw them at the Jamraat (stone walls) to symbolize Abraham's stoning of the devil.
- 7 Back to the Ka'aba for one final Tawaaf (circling) of the Ka'aba
