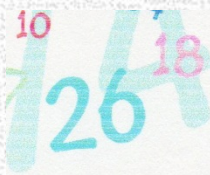

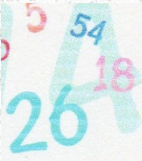

Signs



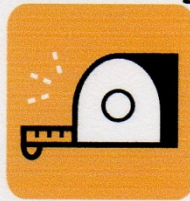
Money signs, money signs
