smoothly (producer)

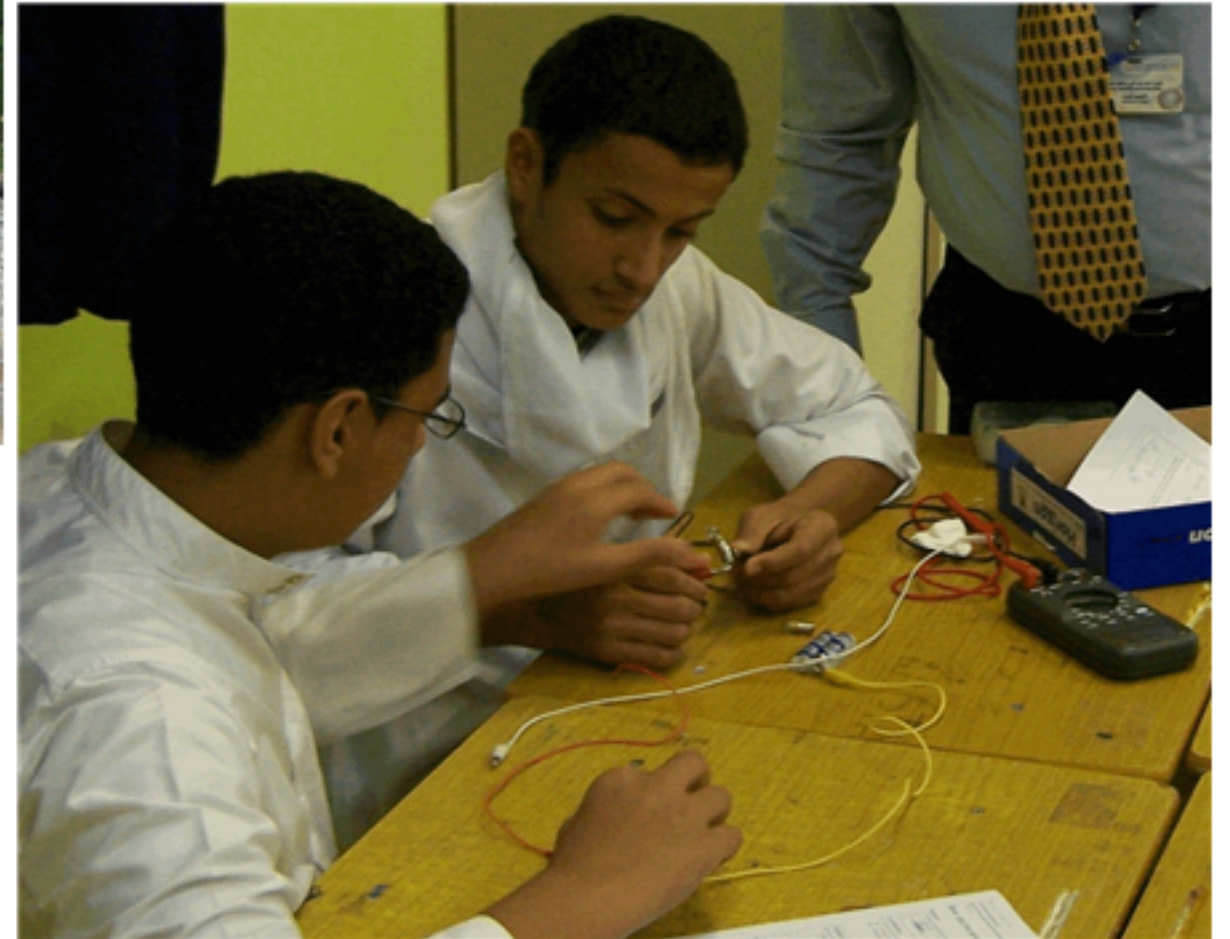
Group work may not be appropriate when the task can be accomplished individually.
