- Course Description:* The second term of topics in algebra. This course continues the exploration of expressions, equations, and inequalities numerically, symbolically, graphically, and verbally. - Homework:* Your homework problems for the entire term are listed on the Homework assignment sheet. The due date for a given section of homework problems will be announced in class. I will collect homework approximately once a week and grade only selected problems out of the collected homework section. No late homework will be accepted. I will drop your lowest two homework scores in determining your overall class homework grade. Each student’s homework grade will be 50 points of their total grade.
- In Class Activities:* There will be approximately 20 in-class activities. These activities will be done in groups and will be collected either at the end of class or the beginning of the following class (at my discretion). Each

student's activity grade will be 50 points of their total grade.

Tests: There will be "midterm" three tests worth 100 points each.
The tests are to be taken at the scheduled times unless arrangements are made **in advance**. Contact your instructor prior to the exam if you are unable to take a test as scheduled. Failure to take the tests at the scheduled time may result in a test score of 0.

Final Exam: A comprehensive two-hour final worth 200 points will be given Monday, March 17th, 2008 at a time to be announced.
