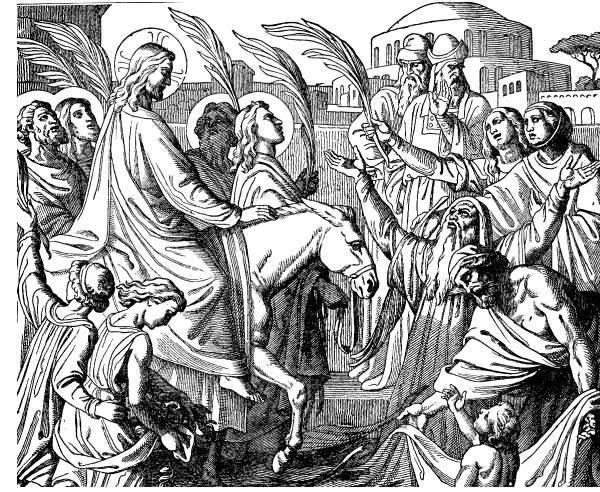

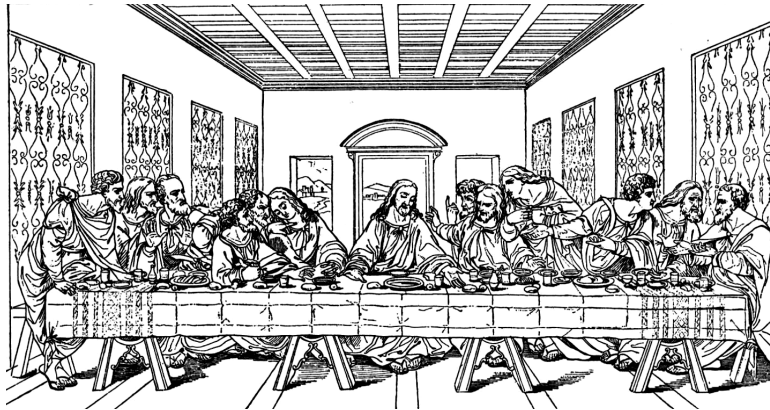
# THE EVENTS OF HOLY WEEK

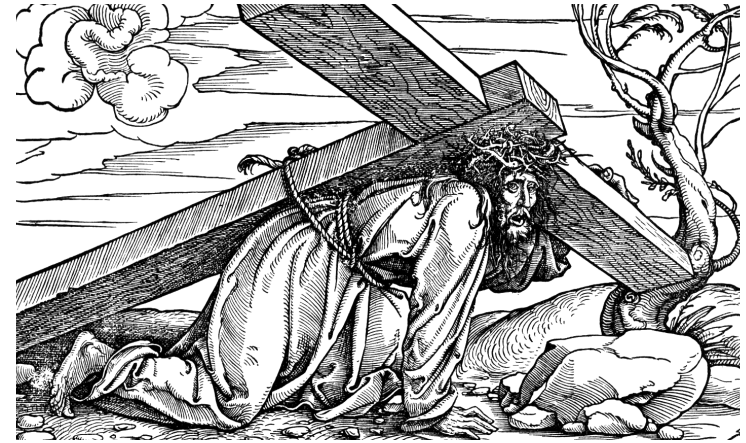
At the Last Supper, Jesus also washes the feet of the Apostles giving them an example of how to serve others. He institutes the priesthood.

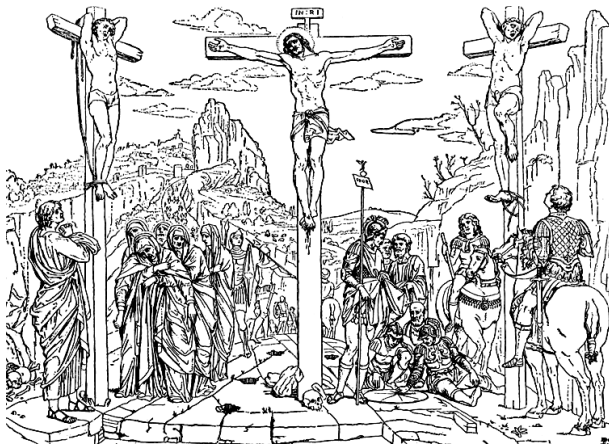

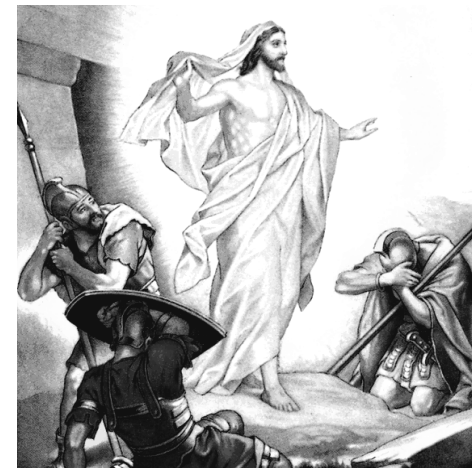
Jesus goes before Pontius Pilate who sentences Him to death. Christ is then whipped, crowned with thorns, and given a heavy wooden cross to carry.
