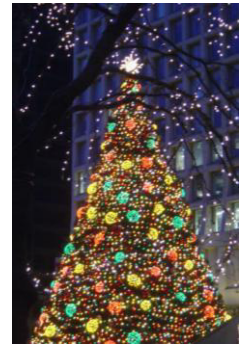


🌿 Christmas in Germany 🌿

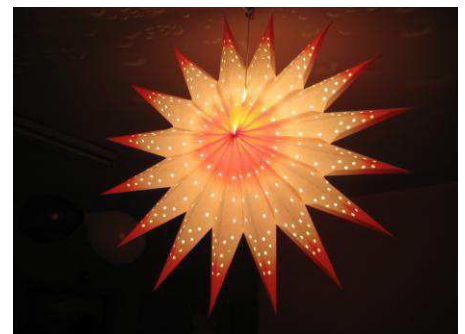


Christmas in India

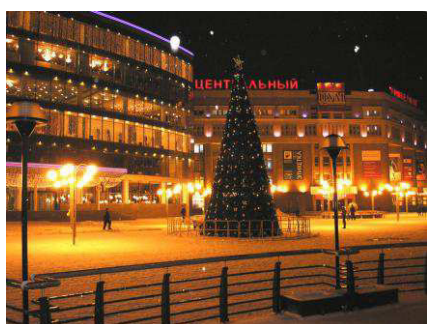


🌿 Christmas in Russia 🌿
