Florence rests along the Arno River and is the birthplace of the Italian Renaissance.

Experience the vast legacies of Venice, Florence and Rome. Study the architecture of Venice's picture-perfect palaces and imagine the centuries-old culture that is still visible in this water wonderland. Discover how Florence's Renaissance introduced the world to opera, artistic genius and Machiavellian politics. In the Eternal City, encounter the enduring influence of emperors and popes who shaped the course of world history.

Day 1 Flight

Overnight flight to Italy • Relax as you fly across the Atlantic.

Day 2 Venice

Arrival in Venice • Arrive in magical Venice, home of Marco Polo.

Day 3 Venice

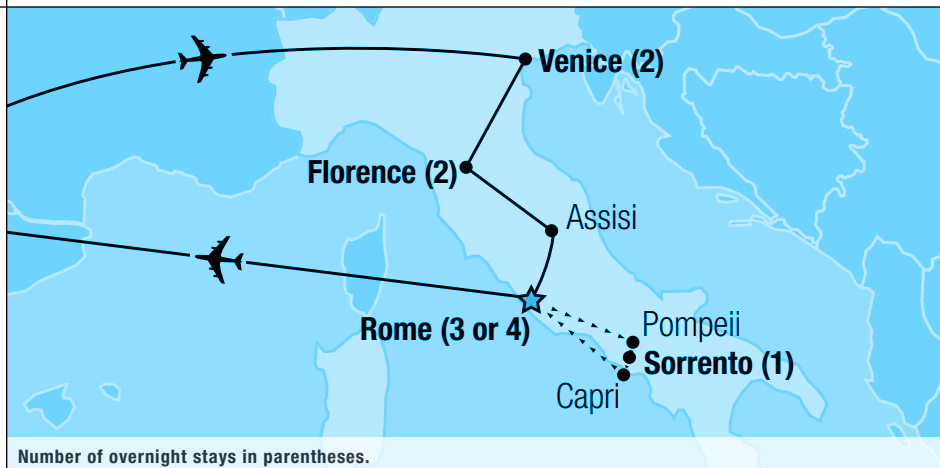
Guided sightseeing in Venice • Begin your tour of *la Serenissima* (the city's nickname meaning "the most serene") at St. Mark's Square, "the finest drawing room in Europe," according to Napoleon. Allegedly buried under the altar of the basilica are St. Mark's remains, which, in the 11th century, were smuggled out of Alexandria in a barrel of salt pork to prevent a thorough search by the city's Muslim guards. Also, see the Grand Canal and the 324-foot Campanile (Bell Tower), whose steps were originally built so that a noble could ascend on horseback. Look for the clock where two bronze figures have been strik-

ing the hour for over 500 years. Venice is also famous for its glassware—you'll see why during a glassblowing demonstration.

Visit to the Doges' Palace • Visit the famous 14th-century pink and white Doges' Palace, from which mighty Venetian dukes once ruled. Here you'll stroll over the Bridge of Sighs, connecting the palace and its prison. As they crossed the bridge, prisoners supposedly sighed with perfect sadness as they regarded their beautiful city for the last time. Casanova made a daring escape from this prison in 1756. Venice is also famous for its glassware—you'll see why during a glass-blowing demonstration.

Day 4 Verona • Florence

Walking tour of Verona • Transfer to Florence by way of Romeo and Juliet's Verona, known for its couplets and Capulets. Here you can see the town's Roman Arena, which dates back to the 1st century A.D. You'll also see a bronze statue of Juliet, standing below the balcony said



to be the one where Juliet called to her Romeo.

Day 5 Florence

Guided tour of Florence • Fall under the spell of the powerful Medici family on today's tour guided by a local expert. Pass the classical statues of the Piazza della Signoria—where Michelangelo's *David* originally stood and now the site of an impressive replica. From behind the Uffizi Palace, you will see Ponte Vecchio, one of the city's only bridges to survive WWII, and now one of its most photographed sites. The bridge provided the Medici easy access from the Pitti Palace to the Uffizi. Continue past the Chiesa di Santa Croce, final resting place of Michelangelo, Machiavelli and Galileo. Next, you will visit the Santa Maria del Fiore Cathedral, better known as the Duomo, or dome, that dominates Florence's skyline. The dome was sculptor and architect Brunelleschi's finest work, and the nearby campanile (bell tower) was designed by the painter Giotto. Look for the famous bronzed doors—Ghiberti's legendary *Gates of Paradise*—at the Baptistery opposite the Duomo. Later, watch artisans at work at a local leather-making demonstration.

Visit to the Accademia • Admire Michelangelo's original statue of *David* inside Florence's acclaimed Accademia Museum. The museum also houses the artist's four famous unfinished statues, the *Prisoners*, as well as hundreds of busts created by Michelangelo's contemporaries.

Day 6 Assisi • Rome

Transfer via Assisi to Rome • En route to Rome, stop in Assisi, birthplace of both St. Francis and St. Clare. Wander through this city, nestled between Mount Subasio and fields of olive groves, which draws millions of tourists every year with its religious significance and some of Italy's finest early Renaissance art. At the Basilica of St. Francis, follow the life of one of Italy's most beloved saints through Giotto's frescoes. Then continue on to Rome.

Day 7 Rome

Arrival in Rome • Arrive in *bella Roma*, the Eternal City. Here, Charlemagne was crowned by the pope in A.D. 800.

Visit to Vatican City • Today, you will explore Vatican City, the world's smallest country. Begin at the Vatican Museum, where elaborate galleries filled with one artistic masterpiece after another lead you directly to the Sistine Chapel. Between 1508 and 1512, Michelangelo painted some of the world's finest pictorial images on the chapel's ceiling. This was his first attempt at working in fresco, which he did by standing up and craning backward from a scaffold. Next, tour St. Peter's Basilica, erected on the site where the saint was martyred. Enter the basilica under the watchful eyes of the brightly dressed Swiss Guard. Inside, admire Michelangelo's *Pietà*, the only sculpture he ever signed.

Day 8 Rome

Guided sightseeing of Rome • Pass the grassy ruins of the ancient Forum Romanum, once the heart of the Roman Empire, and admire the enduring fragments of Rome's glorious past. It was here that business, commerce and the administration of justice once took place. Then visit the mighty Colosseum, Rome's first permanent amphitheater whose three tiers are approximately equal to a 12- to 15-story building. At one time, as many as 50,000 cheering spectators would flock to watch gladiator battles unfold inside. During the staged fights here, as many as 10,000 slaves, prisoners and volunteers were killed. Persecuted Christians were also murdered as spectators saw them mauled by lions. After A.D. 404, gladiator battles ended, but animals were still massacred in the name of sport until the 6th century.

Walking tour of Rome • Continue on to the legendary Trevi Fountain and make sure to toss in a coin to ensure your return to Rome. Then view the Pantheon, one of the best-preserved ancient buildings in the city, commissioned by the Emperor Hadrian around A.D. 120. This

temple to "all the gods" features the second-widest dome in Rome. It was built using the exact proportions of an egg! Finish off in the Piazza Navona, the popular square where you will see Bernini's impressive Fountain of the Four Rivers.

Day 9 Home

Return home • Your tour director assists with the transfer to the airport, where you'll check in for your return flight home.

EXTENSION

Day 9 Pompeii • Sorrento

Guided sightseeing of Pompeii • Learn how wealthy Romans lived 2,000 years ago on an excursion to Pompeii, one of the richest archaeological sites in the world. When neighboring Mount Vesuvius erupted in A.D. 79, volcanic ash completely buried the Roman resort, perfectly preserving the minutiae of daily life. Now it is fully excavated, and you can see ruins of villas, ancient temples and the Stabian Baths.

Arrival Sorrento • Experience the unparalleled beauty of Italy's favorite resort, which overlooks the Bay of Naples.

Day 10 Capri • Rome

Excursion to Capri (weather permitting)

• Enjoy beautiful views of the Amalfi coastline on our excursion across the Bay of Naples to the captivating and mountainous Isle of Capri. Travel by funicular to the town of Capri and board a cruise to see the most spectacular views of Capri's coast. You'll see the Arco Naturale, a majestic stone arch on the eastern cliffs, and the famous Faraglioni, three enormous, pale-ochre limestone colossi that loom out of the sea. When weather conditions do not permit a cruise, groups will visit Villa San Michele in the town of Anacapri instead.

Transfer to Rome • Return to Rome for the night prior to departure.

Day 9 Home

Return home • Your tour director assists with the transfer to the airport, where you'll check in

All-Inclusive Insurance Plan

For the best value, we recommend you purchase this package comprising all three optional plans: Tour Cancellation and Interruption Insurance, Baggage and Property Insurance and Medical and Accident Insurance.

Tour Cancellation and Interruption Insurance

Cancellation and Interruption—Covered reasons:

A refund or partial refund of the Program Fee will be issued should the participant die or be forced to cancel or interrupt his tour due to:

- A serious injury, grave illness leading to hospitalization or death of the participant or of a Family Member (see definition of "Family Member on reverse) prior to the tour.
- The participant being hospitalized while on tour as the result of a serious injury or grave illness.
- A serious injury, grave illness leading to hospitalization or death of a Family Member during the tour.

d) The participant being hijacked, quarantined, required to serve on a jury, subpoenaed, drafted into military service or having his or her home rendered uninhabitable by fire or flood.

e) The participant being directly involved in a traffic accident en route to the departure of an EF tour.

f) Financial strain caused by a parent's involuntary, sudden and unforeseen loss of employment.

Please also refer to the "Exclusions" section.

Cancellation prior to departure

Under this plan, you will be reimbursed for the total paid portion of the tour costs (excluding the \$60 non-refundable premium and the \$95 Lifetime Membership Fee), if the cancellation is due to any above covered reasons:

Interruption during your tour

If any of the covered events occur during the tour, the following are also covered:

- Transportation costs of bus, train or economy airfare by the most direct route (up to a maximum of \$1,000) in order to reach the return destination gateway or to travel from the place where the participant's trip was interrupted to where the trip can be rejoined.
- Any unused air, land or sea arrangements paid by the participant.
- Reasonable costs resulting from a change in the person occupancy rate for prepaid arrangements, if a Family Member's trip is delayed or interrupted for any of the covered reasons and the participant's is not.
- Reasonable additional accommodations and transportation expenses (up to \$100 per day, maximum \$600) if a covered traveling Family Member must remain hospitalized. Receipts must be submitted to make a claim. **All interruptions must be pre-approved by Europ Assistance.**

Medical and Accident Insurance

This comprehensive insurance covers up to a combined maximum of \$35,000 per incident for the following:

- Medical expenses incurred outside the participant's home country for necessary treatment and medication relating to an accident occurring or an illness acquired while on tour. (See "Coverage periods.")
- On Efekta's approval, emergency evacuation to the participant's home country (if medically necessary); or home repatriation in the event of death.
- Reasonable travel and accommodation costs of two Family Members traveling to visit (Efekta will approve number of days) a participant considered to be in a life-threatening situation as diagnosed by a doctor and pre-approved by Efekta.
- An additional \$25,000 in supplementary benefits for disability or death in case of an accident while on tour.
- Local travel expenses to a doctor's office or hospital while on tour, but only when that travel is necessary for the treatment of a condition that is covered by this policy. Travel expenses are limited to the covered person only.
- Pre-existing condition limitation: If you have a pre-existing condition (see "Terms you should know"), you will be covered for any expenses related to the pre-existing condition, only if the condition unexpectedly

deteriorates drastically while you are traveling on tour and up to a maximum of USD 4,000. You may be reimbursed for expenses related exclusively to the deteriorating condition. (See "Coverage periods.")

g) Necessary and reasonable telephone costs up to \$50 in relation to a covered claim.

h) Dental care: If your sound and natural teeth are injured in an accident while on tour, you will be reimbursed for temporary treatment by a dentist during the period of coverage. For acute and necessary treatment of an infected tooth, you are eligible for a maximum benefit of \$200.

What to do

Should you become ill or sustain an injury while on tour, go immediately to a doctor or hospital. In the case of a medical emergency, you must notify Europe Assistance. After you have been treated, be sure to request your receipt for payment and the doctor's report indicating diagnosis, treatment and any other pertinent information. **There is a \$30 deductible per condition for this coverage** (see "Exclusions").

Baggage and Property Insurance

This insurance covers the following:

- Damage to or theft of personal property during tour up to a maximum of \$2,000, including valuable property. (Please observe safety and security guidelines as outlined in "Exclusions.")
- Damage to or theft of valuable property (items valued over \$100) is reimbursable up to \$1,000 per incident, whereof mobile phones up to \$100, MP3 players up to \$200 and video cameras up to \$500.
- Baggage delayed more than 24 hours from the U.S. (\$30 per 24 hours delayed up to a maximum of \$90, refunded upon return, to cover costs incurred only for necessities (toiletries, underwear, etc.), receipts must be submitted).
- Theft of valuable documents like airline tickets, coupons not due to negligence (up to \$500).
- Theft of currency (up to \$300).

A police report and receipts are required for all theft reimbursement. You must report theft during your tour to the local police department and **file a police report** as soon as possible. Your EF Tour Director will assist you. **There is a \$30 deductible per incident** (see "Exclusions").

Optional Extension Insurance

The insurance company will pay the same benefits as are provided elsewhere under this policy during a tour's extension for a maximum of 15 days. You can purchase this insurance to cover you days before or after your tour for \$10 per day.

Coverage periods

Tour Cancellation Insurance coverage begins the day EF Educational Tours receives your application, full payment (due 99 days prior to departure), and the \$60 insurance premium (due 76 days prior to departure). The event or accident that causes you to cancel your tour must have occurred *after* your coverage effective date. **In order for you to obtain tour cancellation benefits, EF Educational Tours must be notified of your need to cancel the tour within 14 days of the event that causes the cancellation or prior to your group's departure, whichever comes first.** (Please see section titled "Exclusions" for more details.)

Coverage for Medical & Accident, Baggage and Property as well as Tour Interruption Insurance begins once you have left the gateway of your departing city on the first day of your tour and terminates at 12:01AM on the day after the scheduled tour ends, the day after you leave the EF program or when the trip is canceled, whichever is earliest, provided the application premium has been paid.

Terms you should know

Here are some definitions that may be helpful to you as you read about our insurance plans.

"Family Member" is defined as a spouse, parent, child, sibling, grandparent, grandchild, legal guardian or live-in companion. Also included are parents, children or siblings of a spouse or live-in companion who is covered under this insurance and is traveling on the same tour.

"Pre-existing condition" is any injury, sickness or condition for which you have received treatment or have been diagnosed, or that would have caused a prudent person to seek diagnosis or treatment, before this insurance coverage takes effect.

How to file a claim

Please contact EF or Efecta/Chickering Claims Administrators and they will send you a Claim Form to fill out. The Claim Form must be filled out completely and must include all the required documentation.

Exclusions for Tour Cancellation and Interruption Insurance

The insurance company will not reimburse you or pay Tour Cancellation/Interruption Insurance benefits due to:

- changes in travel plans due to: carrier caused delays (including bad weather).

- personal change of plans by participant or a Family Member including anxiety or fear; business or contractual obligations.
- prohibition or regulation by any government; default of tour or program operator (including EF Educational Tours and its affiliated parties), airline, cruise line or any other organization that results in a loss of service.
- your inability to obtain the necessary travel documents (passports, visas, etc.); or detention or confiscation by customs.
- a flight delay resulting in missed days on tour.
- The insurance company will also not reimburse you or pay benefits for the participant or any Family Members' loss, illness or injury due to the excluded conditions as stated in the "Exclusions for Medical and Accident Insurance" section of the policy. Please refer to the "Exclusions for Medical and Accident Insurance" for a full listing. Also, the insurance company will not reimburse the participant or pay Tour Interruption benefits for any changes in travel plans due to mental or psychological health disorders, including eating disorders.

Exclusions for Medical and Accident Insurance

The following medical, dental, travel and other expenses are not covered by this insurance policy:

- All expenses resulting from or relating to treatment due to mental or psychological health disorders, including eating disorders, as well as all expenses for treatment of physical symptoms resulting from or relating to the above.
- All expenses resulting from or relating to treatment due to the abuse of alcohol, sleeping pills, narcotics or other intoxicants. As well as expenses resulting from or relating to treatment due to a suicide, suicide attempt, criminal act or violent behavior on your part.

- Maternity expenses or any illness or treatment connected with pregnancy.
- All expenses for treatment or prescription drugs related to a pre-existing condition, insofar as they can be reasonably expected. As well as expenses resulting from or relating to treatment that was required before the effective inception date of this insurance and would have made a prudent person seek care prior to the effective inception date of this insurance coverage.
- All expenses resulting from or relating to treatment for HIV disease or AIDS or any condition related thereto.
- All expenses resulting from or relating to treatment for dental injuries caused by biting or chewing.
- All expenses resulting from or relating to accidents due to risky sporting events or other risky activities, including but not limited to: sporting competitions and training for sporting events or training with a club registered by a national sports association, Australian football, lacrosse, wrestling, martial arts (i.e. judo, karate, tae kwondo, thai boxing, etc.), rodeo, dirt (motor) biking, car racing, motorcycle racing, driving or riding off-road vehicles such as "four wheelers," horse racing, hang gliding, sail flying, bungee jumping, short track skating, skydiving, air ballooning, parachuting, motor competition or similar activities; mountaineering, mountain climbing, whitewater rafting or activities that can be described as expeditions, unless these activities are part of an EF Educational Tours tour.
- The Insurance Company will not pay the related travel costs if a ship or airplane is forced to change its route because of your illness or injury.
- Telephone costs, in excess of \$50, other than for telephone calls to the Insurance Company.
- Expenses beyond those that are reasonable and customary.
- All expenses eligible for reimbursement by other means, including but not limited to another insurance policy or government-sponsored program.
- All expenses for which compensation is obtainable elsewhere by reason of law, other decrees, conventions or other insurance.

Exclusions for Baggage and Property Insurance

This policy does not insure or cover any damage to, loss or theft of:

- Any property left behind, lost or mislaid, even if the property has been stolen after you have left it somewhere.
- Any property left in an unlocked: hotel room, dormitory room, boarding house room, passenger cabin, sleeping car, bus or car.
- Any property left behind overnight in any means of transport. If property is temporarily left in means of transport during the daytime, the property must be locked in a trunk that is inaccessible from the interior or locked in a glove compartment.
- Any cash, valuable property or valuable documents not carried on you or not locked in a safe or a secure box when you are absent from a hotel room, dormitory room or boarding house room. If you are living in a room that cannot be locked by key, or if you live together with other persons not being Family Members, you must store any cash, valuable property or valuable documents in a locked device, e.g. suitcase, drawer, cupboard, etc.
- Any cash, valuable property or valuable documents left in tents, cars, buses, boats, caravans, trailers or any other means of transport.
- Any cash, valuable property or valuable documents checked in with an airline.

- Any damage due to scraping or wear and tear.
- Superficial damage to suitcases that does not affect their use.
- Damage to property insured that occurs from normal wear and tear, rusting, molding or discoloration, or any damage that might affect the appearance but does not affect the function of the property.
- Marring, scratching, peeling of paint or any other damage to the appearance of the property insured not resulting in loss of or injury to its function.
- Any damage due to improper packing.
- Any damage from liquid that flowed out from a packed container.
- Motor-driven vehicles, caravans or trailers.
- Water-going vessels (except windsurfers).
- Any damage that will be paid for through another insurance policy.

General exclusions relating to all types of coverage

No insurance coverage is provided and the insurance company will not pay for any losses resulting directly or indirectly from:

- A willful act or gross negligence on your part or on the part of anyone entitled to receive a benefit;
- War, hostile acts of a foreign power, revolution, usurped power, civil war, acts of war (declared or undeclared), riots or rebellion ("riot" means tumultuous disturbance of the peace by a group of persons whether national or local, gravely threatening the social peace and order of the area) or other disturbances of a similar nature, however not including direct acts of terrorism ("direct", meaning an immediate and geographically proximate threat to personal safety). However, the insurance company will pay up to USD 1,500 for the additional costs incurred if you return home immediately after the outbreak of violence in the area where you are, due to any of the aforementioned excluded events, and in accordance with recommendations by official authorities in your home country (State Department or Ministry for Foreign Affairs).

In order to be entitled to benefits, you must deliver a claim form to the Claims Agent as soon as possible, but at the latest within one year of the time of the loss. If you wait longer than one year, you will not be entitled to any of the benefits.

Nuclear, chemical biological terrorism exclusion clause:

Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary within this insurance or any endorsement thereto it is agreed that this insurance excludes any losses directly or indirectly arising out of, contributed to or caused by, or resulting from or in connection with any act of nuclear, chemical, biological terrorism regardless of any other cause or event contributing concurrently or in any other sequence to the loss.

The policy includes coverage for the duration of your EF Educational Tour. Please be aware that these policies do not include coverage for stay-ahead or stay-behind option periods, unless you have purchased the Optional Extension Insurance.

These Booking Conditions are valid for all EF tours departing October 1, 2008, through September 30, 2009. If you are traveling on a Customized Tour, please refer to the addendum for these tours.

What's included on your tour What does the Program Fee include?

- Accommodations in first-class, superior-tourist-class or tourist-class hotels, as defined by the Official Hotel Guide (except where noted)
- Continental breakfast and dinner daily as specified (different meal plans apply for our Distant Lands tours and Central and South America destinations)

- Comprehensive sightseeing tours and excursions led by licensed local guides as specified
- Airport transfers and transportation between destination cities

- An EF Tour Director available 24 hours a day from when you arrive until you depart, for all European tours. In Hawaii and Fiji, a transfer chaperone will assist you to and from the airport. - Transportation to and from walking tours via coach or public transportation

What is the \$95 Lifetime Membership Fee?

How are departure fees assessed? Departure fees are levied by the airlines and are subject to change. EF evaluates these fees as new information is made available from the airlines several times a year and then updates accounts and invoices accordingly.

Group travel

How does group travel work? Group travel requires some flexibility. Depending on your group's size, you will probably be combined with other groups and travel together on the same tour. To best serve groups of all sizes, your requested tour dates and itinerary may be modified. This is why we ask for a range of dates during which your group is able to travel, as well as alternative destination choices.

How does EF keep its prices so low? By allowing EF flexibility with your tour and travel dates, EF is able to offer our travelers the lowest prices possible, while minimizing any inconvenience.

What is group consolidation? EF's Program Fees are based on a minimum of 35 full-paying participants (Customized Tours may base their Program Fees on different numbers). To qualify for these lowest-priced fees, we usually need to combine smaller groups into a larger one to achieve the required number of travelers. This ensures our travelers receive the best value and allows you to meet teachers and students from other schools, although groups may not be of the same age level.

What if my group can't be booked on our first-choice tour? If we are unable to book your group on your first choice tour, we will move you to a comparable tour. The new tour's Program Fee and airport fees will apply. Please keep in mind that the replacement tour may not include all countries on the original tour. If we fail to offer a comparable tour, participants will receive a full refund.

Can my tour itinerary change? While we make every effort to keep your itinerary as is, there are times when we may need to modify it. Sometimes this involves changing the order in which cities are visited, altering your length of stay in a city or country, or using an alternate airport. **This may also involve a change in the departure, arrival or return date of a tour. EF strives to keep the new departure date within one to two days of the original date on tours departing October through April, and within four days of the original date on tours departing May through September.** On certain dates, especially holidays, some tour inclusions may be unavailable. In such cases, we may have to substitute different inclusions. Your final tour and travel dates will be confirmed approximately 60 days prior to departure.

Private groups

What if my group wants to travel on our own, without being consolidated? If you want the privacy of your own tour bus and an EF Tour Director just for your group, choose to be a private group. This option is available for an additional fee, which varies based on the final number of full-paying participants. As a private group, your tour itinerary cannot be modified while you are on tour. Please keep in mind that while your base itinerary will involve only your group, you may be consolidated with others during optional excursions and airport transfers. Let EF know prior to your first enrollment if you would like to be a private group.

Enrollment

We recommend that our group leaders encourage travelers to enroll as soon as possible because tours tend to fill up quickly. **All enrollment forms must be received at EF by 99 days prior to departure.** Travelers should provide complete first and last names as they appear (or will appear) on their passports as any corrections to passport names made after 99 days prior to departure will incur a minimum \$100 fee per airline and may result in a different flight itinerary from the group.

Can children under 12 go on tour? EF will review enrollment forms from children under 12 years of age on a case-by-case basis. Due to the fast pace of our tours, we do not allow children under the age of 6 to travel with us.

Can adults go on tour? EF's published Program Fees are based on student rates for transportation, admissions, accommodations, etc. We welcome adults (those older than or who will turn 23 years old while on tour), but have to charge a per-person flat fee supplement of \$65, plus \$25 per day of the tour, to cover the difference between student and adult rates. Adults will pay an additional \$45 per night for the sea portion of their tour on overnight ferries and cruises. Please see next page for information on adult rooming.

Passports and visas

Who is responsible for getting travelers' passports and visas? Each traveler must obtain a passport and any applicable visas for his or her tour prior to departure. If a traveler is unable to obtain these travel documents, our Standard Cancellation Policy will apply (see first column on p. 17). Please be sure that passports are valid for at least six months *after* your tour ends. Non-U.S. citizens will need to contact the embassy or consulate of their destination countries to ensure they meet specific entry requirements. Remember to check your itinerary carefully for all countries that you will visit or pass through, including transfers between airports in foreign countries and re-entry into the United States. Visit the U.S. Department of State at travel.state.gov for further information.

Insurance

Can I purchase insurance through EF? We strongly advise all participants to purchase EF's All-Inclusive Insurance to protect themselves while on tour. Most U.S. insurance companies do not provide adequate coverage for people traveling abroad. See third column on p. 17 for details.

Flight information

Which airlines does EF use? EF reserves seats with major airlines, including Aer Lingus, Air Canada, Air France, Air New Zealand, Alitalia, American, British Airways, Continental, Delta, Iberia, KLM, Lufthansa, Northwest, Qantas, South African Airways, SAS, Swiss, United, US Airways, Virgin Atlantic Airways and other U.S. and international carriers.

Will we have direct flights? We always do our best to provide the most direct route to your destination city. However, due to available flight routings, we cannot guarantee non-stop or direct flights. You must travel on all legs of your itinerary. If you do not travel on a portion of your flights, the remaining portions will be cancelled.

Will my group fly together? Depending on seat availability and the size of the plane, we may not be able to accommodate all members of a group on the same flight. Sometimes, groups may travel on an overnight red-eye flight, departing the evening before the tour is scheduled to begin. In rare cases, groups may have a domestic and/or international overnight, layover and/or bus transfer due to space availability, routings and legal connection times. EF is not responsible for airline schedule changes, or mechanical, weather or capacity-related flight delays.

Will my group sit together on the plane? Depending on your group's size, you may sit together. You will receive your seating assignments when you check in.

Can I earn frequent flier miles? Because of our special rates, our contracts do not allow upgrades, stopovers or the accrual of frequent flier miles.

Are any airports interchangeable? Flights to and from the following destinations may originate/end at any of the airports in that vicinity. On occasion, your tour may return to a different airport than the one you departed from.

- New York: Newark, LaGuardia or JFK
- Miami: Miami or Fort Lauderdale
- Washington, D.C./Baltimore: BWI, Dulles or Ronald Reagan National
- Houston: Hobby or George Bush Intercontinental
- Ireland: Shannon or Cork
- Italy: Milan or Venice
- Scotland: Glasgow or Edinburgh

Are there flight restrictions for travelers under 15?

Anyone younger than 15 years old traveling apart from the group without an adult companion must pay the airlines' Unaccompanied Minor Fee at the airport during check-in. Please contact each airline on the minor's itinerary regarding policies for young travelers.

Special Travel Requests

EF is happy to provide stay-ahead/stay-behind options, alternate departure airports and land-only tours for individual travelers or the whole group. Contact us for details about special insurance plans for stay-ahead and stay-behind coverage when participants are not escorted by an EF Tour Director.

What if my whole group wants to do a stay-ahead or stay-behind?

Where possible, EF will provide altered flight and land arrangements for a group of at least six paying participants plus the group leader. Each participant will have to pay a \$95 service charge for such an arrangement, and will be invoiced for any additional air or land costs incurred due to the new itinerary. The group leader should submit one request for the whole group, which needs to be received at EF prior to your first enrollment.

What if only one traveler has a Special Travel Request?

Individual Special Travel Requests should be submitted online at eftours.com by 99 days prior to departure. Please keep in mind that you should not make any actual arrangements—such as booking a flight or hotel—until you receive your final tour itinerary and departure dates around 60 days prior to departure. A \$125 service charge is payable for these arrangements, and the participant will be invoiced any additional costs incurred due to the new itinerary.

What are the types of individual Special Travel Requests?

- **Individual stay-ahead/stay-behind option** Where possible, EF will provide altered flight arrangements, according to your request. Participants are responsible for making their own arrangements to and from the hotel or airport, as well as all land arrangements pertaining to their individual itinerary.

- **Alternate departure airports** The Program Fees offered by EF are based on group departures. If an individual chooses to fly out of a different airport than the group, the Program Fee of the alternate airport will apply. Travelers must depart from and return to the same domestic airport.
- **Land-only tours** On certain tours, participants have the option to make their own flight arrangements and join the tour at the first hotel on the itinerary. Participants are responsible for making their own arrangements to and from the hotel or airport. In this case, the Program Fee may be reduced by up to 30%, depending on the length and destination of the tour. EF is not responsible for any travel-related delays or inconveniences for land-only participants.

If you have requested special travel arrangements, EF cannot guarantee that you will fly with your group in either direction.

Optional excursions

What are optional excursions? EF offers these exciting activities as a supplement to what's already included on your itinerary. Some group leaders choose to add optional excursions to all participant accounts.

When should I purchase optional excursions? To secure a discounted price, optional excursions need to be purchased by 50 days prior to departure. Most optional excursions can be purchased on tour at a slightly higher price (though there are a few that must be purchased prior to departure). Additional details will be sent to participants.

Can I get a refund on optional excursions? If EF has to cancel an optional excursion during a tour (due to low enrollment, for example), you will receive a full refund. To receive a refund for an optional excursion that you simply no longer wish to be enrolled in, you must let us know by 30 days prior to departure. Please note that optional excursion prices are subject to change.

Tour extensions

Many tours offer extensions (availability depends on the number of participants) that add days, destinations and activities to the normal itinerary. Participants must be accompanied by their group leader or a designated chaperone on tour extensions. Tour extension requests need to be received at EF prior to your first enrollment.

Rooming

EF handles final rooming assignments for all travelers. Please ensure that we have all rooming requests, including upgrades, by 70 days prior to departure.

How many students are in a room? Students will room in triples or quads with others of the same gender from your entire tour group. This may mean that students from different schools may room together. EF uses U.S.-style hotels for all tours to Mexico, Central and South America. These rooms contain two double beds (beds for two people), and two students are expected to share each bed.

Can students request a twin room? Students may request twin accommodations (a hotel room with two single beds) for the following additional charges:

- \$25 per hotel night per student
- \$70 per ferry or cruise night per student

(Please note: Twin accommodations are not available on overnight trains.)

How are adults roomed? Adults are placed in twin accommodations (a hotel room with two beds) with another adult of the same gender from the entire tour group. This may mean that adults from different schools/organizations may room together.

Can adults request a room with a double bed?

Adults can request double-bed accommodations (a room with one bed for two people) by simply providing EF with the name of their roommate by 70 days prior to departure.

Can adults request a single room? Adult travelers can request a single room for an additional \$40 per hotel or

cruise night (\$50 per night for South Pacific destinations). Please note: Single rooms are not available on tours to Africa.

What are the sleeping arrangements on trains and ferries? Overnight trains provide *couchette* sleeping berths or *Sessels* (recliners), and cruises and overnight ferries provide cabins. Single rooms are not available on overnight trains.

Protection for travelers' payments

You can rest assured knowing that travelers' tour money is protected in the unlikely event of EF bankruptcy, insolvency or cessation of business under our participation in the United States Tour Operators Association (USTOA) \$1 Million Travelers Assistance Program. For program details and a list of its affiliates, contact USTOA by mail at 275 Madison Avenue, Suite 2014, NY, NY 10016, by email at information@ustoa.com or online at USTOA.com.

Terms and provisions

The terms and provisions of these Booking Conditions supercede any other warranties, representations, terms or conditions, unless they are expressly stated within a Booking Conditions Addendum or in a letter signed by an EF officer. Prices are subject to change.

When does my tour officially start and end? Each tour begins with the take-off from the departure airport, and ends when the flight lands at the return airport. For those making their own flight arrangements, the tour begins upon arrival at the first EF hotel and ends upon departure from the last EF hotel, according to the itinerary. The official length of an EF tour does not include stay-ahead or stay-behind option periods when participants are not escorted by an EF Tour Director.

What happens if EF has to cancel a tour? EF may cancel any tour for events beyond its control, including but not limited to instability in a destination country, acts of God, war (whether declared or undeclared), terrorist activities, incidents of violence, public health issues or quarantine, substantial currency fluctuations, strikes, government restrictions, fire or severe weather conditions which make it impossible or commercially unreasonable in the opinion of EF to conduct the tour. If EF cancels the tour for any such reason, participants will receive an EF Future Travel Voucher for all monies paid, less the \$95 Lifetime Membership Fee and any non-refundable fees. Cancellation by EF for causes described in this section shall not be a violation of its obligations to any participant.

What about lost belongings? EF is not responsible for loss of passports, airline tickets or other documents, or for loss of or damage to luggage or any other passenger belongings. EF is not responsible for locating lost property, unless the loss is due to EF's negligence. In this case, only shipping costs will be charged to the participant. In rare cases, when EF must get involved in the physical retrieval and handling of lost property, a non-refundable service fee of \$45 plus shipping costs will be charged to the participant. Lost luggage will be donated to charity if it remains unclaimed by one year after departure date. In the case of a lost airline ticket, the participant is solely responsible for meeting the airline's requirements (both logistical and financial) for ticket replacement.

What if my tour dates do not fall in the range covered by these Booking Conditions? Participants enrolling on tours departing between October 1, 2009, and September 30, 2010, are subject to these Booking Conditions as well as any changes to EF's 2010 Booking Conditions and payment and cancellation schedules. The 2010 Booking Conditions will be available online at eftours.com/BC in December 2008.

EF Educational Tours are marketed in the U.S. by EF Institute for Cultural Exchange, Inc., which is a member of the global EF group of companies, referred to above as "EF."

If you're just now enrolling, your enrollment form is considered a **Late Enrollment**. Once we have received your full payment by cashier's check, credit card, or money order only, including a non-refundable **\$125 Late Enrollment Charge**, you will be placed on a waiting list while we check bus and flight availability. If we are unable to place you on a tour or offer you an alternate flight to meet up with your tour, you will receive a full refund. We may also offer you the option of arranging your own flight and buying the land-only portion of your tour. We cannot accept enrollment forms **14 days or fewer** prior to departure.

Please allow adequate time for delivery (approximately 10 days) to avoid late payment fees. Late payments must be made by cashier's check, money order or credit card (no personal checks). Your cleared check or credit card statement is your receipt of payment. EF cannot re-submit checks; if a stop payment order is put on a check, or if a check is returned to us by the drawer's bank, a non-refundable \$30 processing fee will be charged. In the unlikely event that an invoice is not received, participants are still responsible for making payments on time. An invoice is sent approximately one month prior to the final due date of 99 days prior to departure.

If you have paid only the non-refundable \$95 Membership Fee at 85 days prior to departure, or, if you are past due by 60 days or more on any payment, EF reserves the right to cancel your reservation.

Peace of Mind Program

Receive an EF Educational Tours Future Travel Voucher For group cancellations, EF's Peace of Mind Program allows participants to receive an EF Future Travel Voucher for all monies paid, less the \$95 Lifetime Membership Fee and any non-refundable fees, if the entire group decides not to travel at least 35 days prior to departure. The Peace of Mind Program and its ability to transfer your monies paid is a benefit of making all payments by dates due. **Participants missing any payment deadlines will need to pay any late fees to qualify for the Peace of Mind Program.** The Future Travel Voucher provided through the Peace of Mind Program is not a merchandise credit or a gift certificate and may not be redeemed for cash.

Payments using EF Future Travel Vouchers Payments using EF Future Travel Vouchers are subject to the same schedule and fees as other forms of payment. The non-refundable portion of your voucher will be treated as a credit toward your final payment. Participants canceling a tour paid for using an EF Future Travel Voucher will be subject to additional cancellation fees associated with that tour. The participant's signature must appear on the voucher for it to be processed. Vouchers may not be split between participants. Only one voucher may be redeemed per person. Full terms and conditions appear on the vouchers.

Change your group's tour EF's Peace of Mind Program allows groups to change their tours and/or departure dates until 35 days prior to departure. This option is only available to the entire group and not to individual participants. If EF cannot accommodate the revised tour request and participants decide not to travel on the original tour, EF's Standard Cancellation Policy will apply. If there are additional fees resulting from the tour/date change, participants will be responsible for the increase. Participants canceling from a revised tour will be charged a cancellation fee based on the date that the original tour was changed or the current tour's cancellation fee, whichever is higher. The revised tour must depart within the date range that these Booking Conditions are valid. EF will make every effort to accommodate the revised tour request.

EF's Booking Conditions: **Cancellations, refunds and insurance**

The cancellation policies outlined below take into consideration the costs EF incurs long before groups ever depart. Notice of cancellation from an EF tour will only be accepted from the participant, his or her legal guardian, or the group leader. The date of cancellation will be determined by the date on which EF receives written notice. Cancellation refunds can only be made to the person whose name appears on the account; monies cannot be transferred to another account.

Group leader cancellation: A group leader must accompany participants on every tour. If a group leader cancels for any reason, EF will ask him or her to assign a new group leader to the group's participants. The new group leader is responsible for any increases in his or her own airline costs. Any participants who cancel at this point and choose not to travel with their replacement group leader will be treated as standard cancellations. If no replacement group leader is found, the affected participants will need to cancel to be eligible for EF's Standard Cancellation Policy. Those participants interested in being placed with a new tour group should contact EF at 1-800-665-5364. If we cannot find a new tour for these participants, EF's Standard Cancellation Policy will apply.

Refunds

Refunds for overpayments will be issued only upon written request and after a participant's check(s) has (have) been in the account for 21 days. Refunds will be issued in the name which appears on the EF account. All refund checks are mailed 4-6 weeks after the request has been processed. **There will be a non-refundable \$30 stop-payment fee for lost refund checks.**

Additional Travel Security

EF is pleased to offer the following Additional Travel Security to our customers to cover cancellations due to an act of terrorism or the threat of an act of terrorism. Through this plan, participants will receive a full refund (less the \$95 Lifetime Membership Fee) should all of the following conditions be met: (a) a terrorist act, or threats of terrorist acts occur(s), which is directed against U.S. interests on U.S. soil or in U.S. airspace or directed against U.S. interests in any other country or in international airspace; and (b) as a result of these events, a formal Travel Warning is issued by the United States Department of State, stating that Americans should not travel to any country or countries that are included in the participant's tour itinerary; and (c) the formal Travel Warning by the U.S. Department of State is issued within 65 days of the participant's departure. Participants missing any payment deadlines will need to pay late fees to qualify for Additional Travel Security.

Release and Agreement

1. I understand and agree that my tour is operated by EF Cultural Travel, LTD., Switzerland, and is marketed by EF Institute for Cultural Exchange, Inc. (together referred to as "EF").

2. I understand that my tour begins with the takeoff from the EF departure airport and ends upon completion of the flight back to the EF airport.

3. I agree to release, indemnify and hold harmless EF and its affiliates (which term shall include parents, subsidiaries, officers, directors, shareholders, agents and employees of EF as well as EF itself) and my school, my school board and group leader (the "Released Parties") from, and agree not to sue the Released Parties for, any and all claims, demands, actions, lawsuits, settlements, judgements, damages, losses, costs and expenses of any nature whatsoever (including attorneys' fees) on account of or arising out of any and all personal injury, death, bodily injury, mental anguish, emotional distress, physical, property or other damage that I may suffer from any cause whatsoever related in any way to my participation in any EF sponsored tour. I further agree to release, indemnify and hold harmless the Released Parties from any and all acts of God, war (whether declared or undeclared), terrorist activities or threats of terrorist activities, instability in a destination country, incidents of violence, public health issues or quarantine or threats of public health issues, substantial currency fluctuations, strikes, government restrictions, fire or severe weather conditions that make it impossible or commercially unreasonable in the opinion of EF to conduct the tour, or the acts or omissions of any other agents over which the Released Parties have no direct or indirect control, including, without limitation, airlines, railways, bus companies, hotels, shipping companies, guides and sub-contracted agents or tour operators. I understand and acknowledge that EF does not own or operate any entity that provides goods or services on my tour.

4. I understand that the air carrier's liability for loss of or damage to baggage or property, or for death or injury to person, is limited by their tariffs or the Warsaw Convention or both.

5. I understand and agree that EF shall have no liability or responsibility for me when I am absent from EF-supervised activities or for non-EF supervised activities, such as visits to friends or relatives or during stay-ahead/stay-behind option periods if the stay-ahead/stay-behind period does not include the services of an EF Tour Director.

6. I understand and agree that EF reserves the right to refuse or cancel my registration at their sole discretion. Group leaders may also refuse or cancel any participant's registration including my own. In such event, Standard Cancellation guidelines as outlined in the Booking Conditions apply.

7. I agree to abide by EF's regulations and the directions of my group leader, my tour director or EF's personnel during my tour. Failure to do so may result in EF terminating me from the tour immediately. I understand that to disobey such rules or directions is to waive the right to a refund of any part of my Program Fee, and that EF may then send me home at my own expense.

8. I agree to abide by all local laws when abroad, including those concerning drugs and alcohol. (Minors must have parents' permission to use alcohol even if the local law would otherwise permit them to.) I understand that if I abuse or disobey such laws, even unintentionally, I waive my right to a refund of any part of the Program Fee, and EF may send me home at my own expense. I also understand that should local authorities be involved, I will be subject to the laws of the country I am visiting.

9. I understand and agree that if I become ill or incapacitated, EF and its employees, or my group leader, may take any action they deem necessary for my safety and well-being, including securing medical treatment (at my own expense) and transporting me home.

10. I understand and agree that EF has the right to make changes in tour itineraries and departure dates, and to modify transportation arrangements, including the use of substitute airlines. In the event of such changes, refunds will be given only in accordance with the provisions of the Booking Conditions supplied herewith.

11. I understand that by enrolling on this tour, I have made the choice to travel with the teacher/group leader organizing my group, and I understand that this choice is not the responsibility of EF. I understand that a group leader must accompany me on tour. If my group leader cancels for any reason, EF will ask him or her to assign a new group leader. If I cancel at this point and choose not to travel with the replacement group leader, I will be treated as a standard cancellation. If no replacement group leader can be found, I will need to cancel and EF's Standard Cancellation Policy will apply. I may also request that EF place me with a new tour group. If EF cannot find a new tour group for me, EF's Standard Cancellation Policy will apply.

12. I understand that it is my responsibility to secure the necessary travel documents (passport and visa[s]) unless specifically arranged for the group by EF. Failure to do so does not constitute grounds for a refund except according to the Standard Cancellation guidelines as outlined in the Booking Conditions.

13. I understand that I will be required to pay for any phone calls or incidental personal expenses that I incur at hotels, as well as for any damage I cause to hotel rooms, buses or other property.

14. I understand that this tour has been designed for students, as reflected in the pacing, educational content, accommodations and other aspects of the tour.

15. I understand and agree that this agreement and EF's Booking Conditions constitute the entire agreement between EF and me with reference to the subject matter herein, and I do not rely upon any promises, inducements or agreements not herein, including but not limited to any oral statements made to me by any agents or employees of EF, or by my school or group leader. This agreement may be amended or modified only in writing, signed by both parties. The waiver by EF of any provision of this Agreement shall in no way affect the remaining provisions of this Agreement, and this Agreement shall be interpreted as if such clause or provision were not contained herein.

16. I understand and agree that this agreement shall be governed in all respects, and performance hereunder shall be judged, by the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. In the event of any claim, dispute or proceeding arising out of my relationship with EF, or any claim which in contract, tort, or otherwise at law or in equity arises between the Released Parties, whether or not related to this agreement, the parties submit and consent to the exclusive jurisdiction and venue of the courts of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and of the United States District Court for the District of Massachusetts.

17. For participants in Utah only: I understand that this tour is not sponsored by any public school, public school district or other public entity, and is operated and organized by a privately owned company.

18. I understand and consent that EF may use any film likenesses taken of me and any of my comments while on an EF tour for future publicity and also use my contact information for future EF promotions.
