There is a 10-student minimum for all group tour programs.

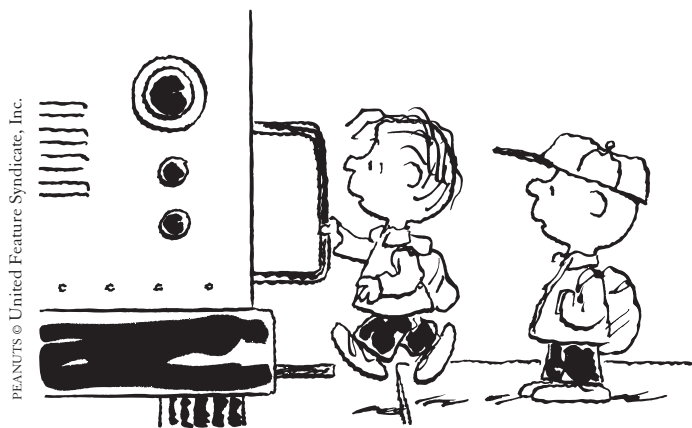
MAKING YOUR RESERVATIONS



WOODSTOCK: SMALL IS BEAUTIFUL

September through October 2006, only

Learn about the **Peanuts** character, Woodstock, and spend free time searching for him all over the Museum. Students will also learn to draw cartoon birds and maybe even Woodstock himself. *Appropriate for all ages.*

Flock to the Schulz Museum to see all 76 Woodstock statues in one place! For one week only, students can tour the Woodstock exhibit and enjoy a docent-led tour of the Woodstock statues. *Appropriate for all ages.*

FOR PRE-K – 2ND GRADE

WHO IS SNOOPY?

This introduction to museums, Charles Schulz, and **Peanuts** is specially designed for young students. Children will enjoy a story time and a touch-friendly tour of the Museum. They will also play drawing games, create their own cartoons, and watch a **Peanuts** animated special.

FOR 2ND – 4TH GRADE

LOCAL HERO: THE STORY OF CHARLES M. SCHULZ

Explore the life and career of Charles Schulz and his contributions to local history. Learn to draw your own cartoons and some of Schulz's most beloved **Peanuts** characters.

From November 6, 2006–February 26, 2007, get a special look at the 15-year history of the Redwood Empire Ice Arena's Christmas ice shows and its impact on our community.

FOR 3RD GRADE AND ABOVE

THE ART OF THE STORY

Learn how Charles Schulz and other cartoonists use their own life experiences to develop characters and convey stories in just four cartoon panels. Explore the key elements of a story and learn to tell your own story with images in a hands-on cartoon workshop.

FOR 3RD GRADE AND ABOVE

THE ART OF CARTOONING

Cartoons make us laugh, tell stories, and comment on the world around us. Learn how cartoonists use simple lines to show complex characters and emotions. Students will tour the Museum and create their own animation sequence for our giant zoetropes.

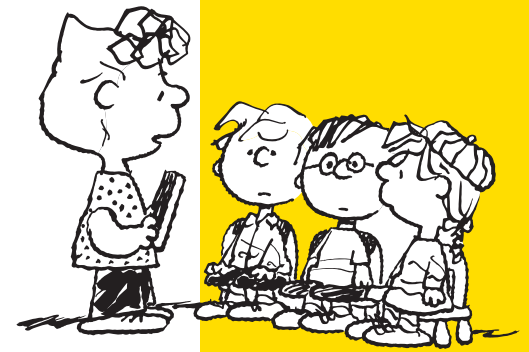
Supports grades 3–6 Visual Arts content standards.
