### ***iEARN Holiday Cards-***

#### ***Korean Dolls***

*Investigating traditional clothing of Korea.*

*The traditional costume is called a **hanbok**, the women's **hanbok** comprises a wrap skirt, and a bolero jacket, called a **Chim-jeogori**, **chima** being the Korean word for skirt and **jeogori** the word for jacket.*

*The men wear roomy pants bound at the ankles and a short jacket called **banji**.*

*The **hanbok** consists of straight lines and smooth curves, with no pockets or buttons and held closed with strings, belts, or cords.*

*Koreans used to favour the colour white for their clothing. However, according to the season or a person's status in society, the colour, material and manner of wearing the clothes varied.*

*The upper class and royalty wore colours, but the ordinary people were only allowed to wear coloured clothing to ceremonies such as weddings. Young women wore red **chima** and yellow **jeogori** before marriage and red **chima** and green **jeogori** after the wedding.*

#### ***Materials***

*Cardboard cone 18cm for the body*

*Poly ball or big beads 50mm for the head*

*Felt for the jeogori or jacket*

*Poly cotton for skirt or pants.*

*Satay sticks*

*Chenille sticks for arms*

*Permanent markers for hair, lips, eyes.*

*Coloured braid, ribbon, metallic yarn for decorating the jeogori.*

*Small jewels or large sequins for jacket fastening.*

*Craft glue.*

## **Method**

1. Use permanent markers to make hair and facial features.
2. Cut a rectangle of fabric for the Chima orskirt (16cmx50cm)  
Run tacking stitch along top edge. Draw thread to gather the top of the skirt.
3. Jeogori- jacket. Cut rectangle of felt (20cmx 10cm). Fold in half. \*Cut a small rectangle away from both the right and left bottom corners, through both sides. (6cmx1cm)  
\*Cut a **V** shape away from just one side (front) in the middle of the folded Felt. The wide part of the **V** should sit along the folded top and the point of the **V** should end in the middle of the cut edge.  
\*Decorate the arms of the Jeogori with a gold paint pen.  
\*Make braid by plaiting lengths of Metallic yarn together.  
Attach the braid around the edge of the **V** neck line with glue.
4. Push a satay stickup through the inside of the cone and into the bottom of the doll's head.
5. Create arms by twisting chenille stems and attaching them with glue. You can glue the head at the same time.
6. Add the skirt by gluing the gathered fabric about 4cm from the top of the cone.
7. Place the Jeogori over the arms and chest of the doll. Glue the sleeve seams together over each arm. Fold the **V** front edges over one another and glue in place.
8. Glue a small bow or jewel where the front of the Jeogori and Chima meet.

## **BOYS COSTUME**

Work the same as the female costume for the top, but make it a little longer.

Cut 2 pants patterns and sew crutch together. Then sew the sides. Finally do a running stitch around the top edge and draw the thread in to gather the fabric at the waist.

## ***ADDITIONS.***

*Print a border along the bottom of your dolls skirt using printing foam and some gold paint.*

*Add earrings using pins and beads.*

*A crown using strips of shiny card board*

*Create a fan for your doll.*
