

QUOTES & SOURCING

- All sources must be credited (including articles, books, websites, blogs, magazines, newspapers, etc.).
- All passages copied verbatim (that is, word by word) must be put in quotation marks and sourced.
- All passages that are paraphrased (that is, rewritten in your own words) must be sourced.

Examples of passages that can be quoted:

- Full paragraphs
- Full sentences
- Sentence fragments:

Example: George Lipsitz writes that African Americans have sought to “turn national minorities into global majorities by affirming solidarity with ‘people of color’ all around the globe.” (Lipsitz 1994: 221).

- Particular phrases, expressions or even single words used by the referenced author:

Example 1: Native performers recreated ancient choreographies through what the author calls “ancestral memory” (p. 12).

Example 2: “Structures of feeling” (Raymond Williams) inform our everyday dealings with the social world.
