## ***Foreshadowing: Predict the Conclusion***

Foreshadowing is a technique authors use to drop hints about future events in a novel. The author has dropped clues throughout the novel that give an idea of what is to come. This assignment requires you to pull together everything you have learned up through Chapter 27, from literary devices to themes to plot structure, and hypothesize how the book will end. Can you do it? This activity allows you to test your analytical abilities.
