CAMP VISITS

Asking questions is key to a good camp experience

When you receive a camp's brochure, you will invariably have questions for the camp director. From that first phone call or letter, you begin developing an impression of what a particular camp is like and how it's run. A camp may be described in nothing less than glowing terms in its brochures. The setting may be absolutely breathtaking. Activities may run the gamut from racquetball to modern dance. In the end, however, it's the human equation of how those activities are operated and conducted that determines the quality of the camp program. Get to know the camp director as a person through telephone conversations, correspondence, and a personal visit. Have the director describe the camp's philosophy and how it is carried out by the staff.

What is the camp's philosophy and program emphasis?
Each camp has its own method of constructing programs based on its philosophy. Does it complement your own parenting philosophy? Many camps actively promote competition and healthy rivalry among camp teams, as reflected in team sports. For many campers this is pure fun. Some parents feel that learning to be competitive at an early age teaches essential survival skills. However, other parents and educators are in favor of cooperative learning. Research has shown that noncompetitive methods encourage young people to learn more, retain it longer, and develop greater self-esteem and appreciation for others. Knowing your child's personality and style of learning is valuable in selecting the right camp.

What is the camp director's background?
American Camp Association minimum standards recommend directors possess a bachelor's degree, have completed in-service training within the past three years, and have at least 16 weeks of camp administrative experience before assuming the responsibilities of director.

What training do counselors receive?
At a minimum, camp staff should be trained in safety regulations, emergency procedures and communication, behavior management techniques, child abuse prevention, appropriate staff and camper behavior, and specific procedures for supervision.

What is the counselor-to-camper ratio?
American Camp Association standards require different ratios for varying ages and special needs. Generally, the ratios at resident camps range from one staff for every six campers ages 7 and 8; one staff for every eight campers

ages 9 to 14; and one staff for every 10 campers ages 15 to 18. At day camps the ratios range from one staff for every eight campers ages 6 to 8; one staff for every 10 campers ages 9 to 14; and one staff for every 12 campers ages 15 to 18.

What are the ages of the counselors?
American Camp Association standards recommend that 80 percent or more of the counselor/program staff be at least 18 years old. Staff must be at least 16 years old and be at least two years older than the campers with whom they work.

What are desired qualities in camp staff?
The same qualities of trustworthiness and dependability sought by any employer are valued commodities in camp employees. Also, the ability to adapt to a variety of situations, empathy for and ability to work with camp clientele, a strong self-image, and an outgoing personality are important characteristics for camp staff.

What percentage of the counselors returned from last year?
Most camps have from 40-60 percent returning staff. If the rate is lower, find out why.

How are behavioral and disciplinary problems handled?
This is where the director's philosophy comes through loud and clear. Positive reinforcement, assertive role-modeling and a sense of fair play are generally regarded as key components of camp counseling and leadership. Rules are necessary in any organization, and the disciplinary approach taken should be reasonable and well communicated. If penalties are involved for violations, they should be applied quickly, fairly, calmly, and without undue criticism to campers.

How does the camp handle special needs?
If your child has special requirements, ask the camp director about needed provisions and facilities. Is there a nurse on staff? A designated place to store insulin or allergy medicine? Are special foods available for campers with restricted diets? Every question is important.

How does the camp handle homesickness and other adjustment issues?
Again, the camp's philosophy on helping children adjust is important. Be sure you are comfortable with the camp's guidelines on parent/child contact.

What about references?
This is generally one of the best ways to check a camp's reputation and service record. Directors should be happy to provide references.

Listing your child's way to a great time at camp

Check out the checklists before checking your kids into camp

Lip balm, sunscreen, a good pair of shoes and ample clothes — all important items to pack before sending a child off to summer camp.
But experts say when it comes to parents preparing their kids for camp, what they say to the child is almost as important as sticking to the camp's packing recommendations.
Marty Ferguson, director for Camp Chief Ouray at YMCA of the Rockies near Granby, said it's vital that parents try to get their child excited about heading off to camp — a nerve-racking experience for many youngsters.
One of the worst things parents can tell their kids, Ferguson said, is to try the camp for a few days, and if they don't like it, they can come home.
Letters about how much the parents miss their kid aren't as

helpful as letters about how much fun a kid could be having at camp, she said.
Parents can also help make sure their kid has a good time at camp by making sure the kid is physically and emotionally ready for the experience. That means making sure they are in shape and can handle the long walks and hours spent in the hot sun.
"Make sure they are comfortable being in the outdoors," she said.
If a child doesn't mind sharing things and borrowing things — two important facts of life at camp — they have a leg up before they get to camp, too, Kalina said.
Beyond the positive encouragement, Ferguson said it's important that parents read all the documents the camp sends before sending their child off. It sounds easy, but Ferguson said that doesn't always happen.
"A lot of it is just FYI type of

stuff, but a lot of it is also pretty important," he said.
Particularly when it comes to the camp's rules on cell phones

and iPods and iPads, parents need to make sure they aren't sending their kid to camp with something they aren't supposed to have.

Getting ready for camp

Age and personality are big factors in whether kids are ready to sleep away from mom and dad

When it comes to figuring out whether your kids are ready for summer camp, it's essential to know what your child's character is like, said Jeff Dolgan, PhD and senior psychologist in the Department of Behavioral Health at Children's Hospital Colorado.
"A lot of it depends on age," said Dolgan, a clinical psychologist who works with both parents and kids. "Certain kids and certain temperaments are not so good with new experiences."
Some professionals say summer camp isn't ideal for those kids under 7 years old, Dolgan said. "A lot of kids feel kind of sent away and kind of abandoned in a way and they're just not emotionally mature enough to manage that," he said.
Other kids are of course more independent, open to new experiences and willing to try new things, he said. That's why the first piece of advice Dolgan tells parents is:

"You know your kids best."
There are a few ways that parents can brace kids for spending a week or two away from home for the first time. For example, parents could set up a tent in the backyard and invite some of their child's friends over for a slumber party. Parents can also bring their child to the actual camp to see what it looks like and to get their children familiar with the scenery.
"There's always room for what we would call 'behavioral rehearsal,'" said Dolgan.
Summer camps do provide kids with a host of benefits if they choose to take advantage of them, Dolgan said.

Summer camping in your own back yard

Parents can't always afford to make a long-term commitment when it comes to keeping their kids active for the summer.
According to Sherri-Jo Stowell, spokeswoman for Aurora's Parks, Recreation and Open Space Department, that's where the city can help. With a multitude of day programs based at the city's recreation centers and pools, parents who can't afford to send their kids off to a long-term summer camp can still find affordable and enriching ways to make their children's summer memorable.
"Our day camps have gained popularity recently because of the cost effectiveness. You're looking at a big chunk of change all at once to sign your kid up for camp and send them away," Stowell said. "You can pay per session. If you leave that day and love it, you can sign up for other days right then and there ... I think that's how a lot of people operate."
That type of day-by-day structure is how one of the city's oldest summer traditions operates. The "Sun and Fun" program at Utah Pool,


1800 S. Peoria St., welcomes elementary and middle school kids on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from June to August. The program runs from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. and combines swimming with a variety of other activities, from arts and crafts to cooking, Stowell said. The drop-in fee for a day is \$23.
"They incorporate a craft, or a cooking class, or some kind of fun and educational activity with swimming," Stowell said. "That's been going on for years. That's one of our favorite City of Aurora summer traditions."
A new activity this year will connect kids aged 6 to 12 years old with science-based learning. A series of day camps at Expo Recreation Center at 10955 E. Exposition Ave. will stress a curriculum that ranges from forensic investigation to magic tricks, all in an effort to make scientific principles fun and exciting for kids, Stowell said.
"We've never done anything quite like this. They're going to be doing science experiments, even incorporating magic tricks," Stowell said. "There's one called 'Science Wizards.'"
A full list of day camps is available at auroragov.org, and kids and parents can get an early start registering for classes at the city's Summer Extravaganza slated for 10 a.m. on March 28 at the Central Library, 14949 East Alameda Parkway.


