

How Backyard Farming Works:

Locally, Cam McDonald is an example of a backyard farmer, who makes use of other people's property (with permission) to farm. McDonald has produced enough food in an average urban backyard to feed 70 people (Tracey, 2009). Excessive food may be stored for some time in order for soil to be rejuvenated. In addition to McDonald's backyard farming experiment, drip irrigation will be combined in order to preserve water and prevent runoff.

The drip irrigation tool will be made from simple house hold items. Backyard farming aims to lower the cost of living (through food consumption), and therefore would also provide tutorials on how to make household tools without paying extra money to encourage more people to join the agricultural revolution. Fertilizers and pesticides can be mixed within the drip irrigation system, in which will be organic, made from household products.
