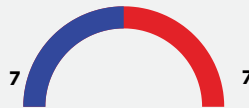

General Election Rules

Uncontested Elections

- Uncontested elections are not canceled

Write In

- Write-in candidates must file by the second Friday preceding the election

Replacement Candidates

- Replacement candidates are allowed

Winning

- Plurality
- No general runoff

Primary Election Rules

Uncontested Elections

- Uncontested elections are not canceled.

Recognized Political Parties

- Major
 - Democratic, Republican
- Minor
 - Green, Libertarian, Natural Law, U.S. Taxpayers, Working class

Write In

- Write-in candidates need to file by the second Friday preceding the election.

Winning

- Plurality required
- No outright win
- No primary runoffs

Local Rules



- Detroit
 - Wayne County publishes rolling certified results, so be careful with write-ins/regular certified results to make sure they cover all of Detroit.
