PETITION TO RECALL OTHONIEL SIERRA
FROM THE OFFICE OF THE CITY OF ENGLEWOOD COUNCIL MEMBER DISTRICT 1
STATEMENT OF CHARGES

Mayor Othoniel Sierra is derelict in his duties representing his constituency.

He fails to provide the necessary leadership to overcome issues plaguing the city, including rampant crime and drug problems as well as fiscal mismanagement, resulting in civic and economic instability. This includes his failure to focus on issues related to a declining business community, choosing to support efforts to increased density.

He supports zoning changes contemplated in the "Code Next" project, which includes introducing multiplex housing in R1 neighborhoods and the prolific use of accessory dwelling units throughout the city.

Mayor Sierra votes favorably for high-density housing projects negatively impacting adjacent neighborhoods and surrounding areas, ignoring Englewood's already high-density rate.

He completely disregards legitimate concerns voiced by Englewood residents related to:

- inadequate infrastructure and financial resources necessary for supporting increased density,
- inevitable obvious, significant negative economic and environmental impact on homeowners & renters, and
- irreparable damage to established neighborhoods.

Further, Mayor Sierra avoids conducting important impact studies including traffic, water, sewage, environmental issues, child safety, prolonged construction noise and interference, to name a few, which would support citizens' concerns.

STATEMENT OF DEFENSE

This is a surprising recall since it is based on discussions this council had to bring more affordable and attainable housing to the city. As part of these discussions, one item that we considered was allowing multi-family homes, such as duplexes/triplexes/quad-plexes into single family areas. After discussions with citizens through town halls and other meetings, city council decided this was not the best path forward. This is how a good council should work; look at the major issues affecting our city, come up with several options, meet with our neighbors and constituents, and then make a decision.

I am proud to work with a city council that looks at all avenues to solve the biggest issues affecting Englewood. Over the past two years, we've created master plans for our water, sewer, and stormwater infrastructure, partnered with Littleton and Sheridan on a Tri-Cities Homelessness Action Plan, and added 6 additional sworn officers to the 2023 budget to help combat crime. This feels like this is an attempt to keep future councils from looking at any major items for fear that it may lead to a recall.

**PETITION TO RECALL JOE ANDERSON
FROM THE OFFICE OF THE CITY OF ENGLEWOOD COUNCIL MEMBER DISTRICT 3**

STATEMENT OF CHARGES

Councilman Joe Anderson is derelict in his duties representing his constituency. He is unapproachable, often rebuffing questions or concerns raised by Englewood citizens.

He is the outspoken leader on City Council in favor of implementing zoning changes contemplated in the "Code Next" project, which includes introducing multiplex housing in R1 neighborhoods and the prolific use of accessory dwelling units throughout the city. He refuses to acknowledge contrary opinions of informed citizens in the city, choosing rather to be influenced by outside sources.

Councilman Anderson votes favorably for high-density housing projects negatively impacting adjacent neighborhoods and surrounding areas, callously disregarding Englewood's already high-density rate.

He ignores legitimate concerns voiced by Englewood residents related to:

- inadequate infrastructure and financial resources necessary for supporting increased density,
- inevitable obvious, significant negative economic and environmental impact on homeowners & renters, and
- irreparable damage to established neighborhoods.

Further, Councilman Anderson avoids conducting important impact studies including traffic, water, sewage, environmental issues, construction noise and interference, to name a few, which would support citizens' concerns.

His unwillingness to address rampant crime and drug problems, together with his lack of attention to fiscal management by city officials, contributes to ongoing civil and economic instability.

STATEMENT OF DEFENSE

Some people misunderstand the disagreements that come in public debate; just because I don't agree with someone doesn't mean I haven't listened. I have carefully listened to hours of feedback at council meetings, public forums, on the phone, and in person with constituents from all different viewpoints on many different issues.

I love listening. My constituents contribute new ideas to vital conversations. Together we made major infrastructure investments, doubled our street maintenance program, added four new police officers and a variety of alternative policing programs.

But some people just want to shut important conversations down. I've heard them out, but the conversation needs to continue. We have an increasing variety of citizens who need different housing types. That's healthy. How do we serve that need? After listening to citizen feedback, council unanimously rejected a proposal to allow affordable multifamily units in our single family zones. The same feedback says citizens want freedom to build ADUs for an aging relative or a kid getting started, without choking on red tape. I support that. I'm against unnecessary red tape all around.

So let's keep the conversation going, and build what works for our city's future. Questions? Call me.

**PETITION TO RECALL CHERYL WINK
FROM THE OFFICE OF THE CITY OF ENGLEWOOD COUNCIL MEMBER AT-LARGE**

STATEMENT OF CHARGES

Councilwoman Cheryl Wink is derelict in her duties representing her constituency.

Her participation on City Council is marked by inconsistency, inaccessibility and condescension towards those she represents. Beginning 1/18/22, Cheryl Wink missed excessive City Council meetings, study sessions, executive sessions, and committee meetings as assigned.

Councilwoman Wink supports zoning changes contemplated in the "Code Next" project, including introducing multiplex housing in R1 neighborhoods and the prolific addition of accessory dwelling units throughout the city ignoring Englewood's existing high-density rates in Colorado. She also votes favorably for high-density projects negatively impacting adjacent neighborhoods.

She callously disregards legitimate concerns, consistently voiced by significant numbers of Englewood residents, related to:

- inadequate infrastructure and financial resources necessary for supporting increased density,
- inevitable significant negative economic impact on homeowners & renters, and
- irreparable damage to established neighborhoods.

She joins City Council members avoiding conducting impact studies related to traffic, water and sewage, environmental issues, etc. which would support citizens' concerns.

Her unwillingness to address rampant crime and drug problems, together with her lack of attention to fiscal management by city officials, contributes to ongoing civil and economic instability.

STATEMENT OF DEFENSE

This recall petition is promoted by a small group of people who believe I should not serve as your Council member because the Englewood City Council EXPLORED housing ideas to address our region's affordable housing crisis. Should City Council be punished for DISCUSSING how to address our most pressing issues? Council heard our constituent concerns about density in neighborhoods and decided not to pursue multifamily units in all residential areas. Further, during my time on Council I have advocated for and funded four new police officers, two Co-Responders, and a homelessness coordinator shared by Englewood, Sheridan and Littleton—all of which has led to a reduction in crime in the city including a 5% drop in car theft. We have invested in \$18.4 million to address flooding, have tripled our investment in streets starting this year, and have committed \$200 million to improve the resilience and quality of our water system. In short, we have listened to our neighbors and are working everyday to improve the community we love.
