ICPSR has converted all statewide referenda returns from 1968-1990 into machine-readable form. Included in this portion of the collection are the county vote breakdowns for approximately 4,241 referenda voted upon in primary and general elections throughout the United States. A typed hardcopy codebook accompanies each state file. The primary election data are NOT available in machine-readable form. It is possible to supply, on a cost basis, limited portions of the referenda and primary election returns in the form of photocopies.

**LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL'S  
STATEMENT OF MEANING AND PURPOSE**

**H.J.R. No. 3**

The purpose of this proposed amendment to Section 20, Article III, of the Constitution of the State of Idaho, is to remove the prohibition against the Legislature authorizing a lottery or gift enterprise.

**Effect of Adoption**

If adopted, this proposed constitutional change would prohibit the Legislature or the people from authorizing any game of chance, lottery, gift enterprise or gambling except in three narrow areas. The three areas are: 1) a state lottery authorized by the state only if it is conducted in conformity with the law, 2) pari-mutuel betting only if enacted into law and conducted in conformity with the law, and 3) charitable games of chance only if operated by qualified charitable organizations only for the pursuit of charitable purposes and only if conducted in conformity with the law. In 1988, the Legislature of the State of Idaho enacted Senate Bill No. 1471 which would establish an Idaho Lottery Agency if House Joint Resolution No. 3 (this amendment) is approved by the electorate at the general election in 1988. Senate Bill No. 1471 provides a temporary line of credit for start-up costs of \$1,000,000 to the Idaho Lottery Agency. The line of credit may be used only in the first eighteen months of the Idaho Lottery Agency's existence and will be reimbursed to the State at the interest rate of ten percent (10%) per annum.
