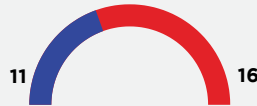

General Election Rules

Uncontested Elections

- Uncontested elections are canceled if there was only one candidate in the primary.

Write In

- Write-in candidates must file by June 17, 2022

Replacement Candidates

- Replacement candidates allowed

Winning

- Plurality
- No general runoff

Uncontested Elections

- Uncontested elections are canceled.

Recognized Political Parties

- 2 major parties and 9 minor parties
- Major parties:
 - Democratic and Republican

Write In

- Write-in candidates need to file by June 17, 2022

Winning

- Plurality required
- Yes outright win
- No primary runoffs

Local Rules



- City, county, and school board elections have the same filing deadline, primary date, and general election date as the state.
- Nonpartisan primaries function as general elections, and the general elections for those offices function as general runoffs.
- We cover all races on the ballot in Jacksonville as it is a city-county (combined with Duval County)
