General Election Rules

Uncontested Elections

- Uncontested elections are not canceled- uncontested candidates receive votes in the general.

Write In

- Write-in candidates must collect signatures for petitions and file a declaration of intent for certification on the ballot.

Replacement Candidates

- Replacement candidates are appointed by the nominating party.

Winning

- Plurality
- No general runoff

Primary Election Rules

Uncontested Elections

- Uncontested elections are not canceled.

Recognized Political Parties

- Democratic Party
- Republican Party
- Constitution Party
- Libertarian Party

Winning

- Plurality required
- No outright win
- No primary runoffs

Write In

- Write-in candidates are only permitted in general elections, per Indiana SOS.

Local Rules



- Indianapolis is holding regular elections in 2022.
- Indiana counties use the same election dates and most of the same filing dates as the statewide election.
- Indiana Superior Court Judges appear on the general election ballot only and are nonpartisan.
- 13 school boards in Indiana are holding regular elections in 2022.
 - They are general elections only and are nonpartisan.
 - Results are certified based on timetable set by county elections board.
