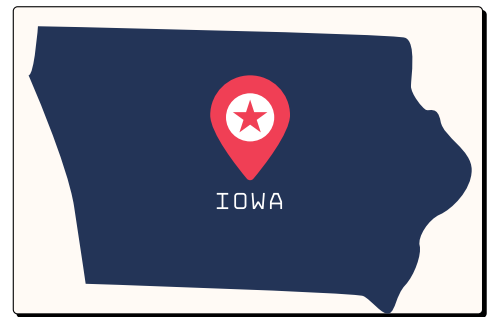

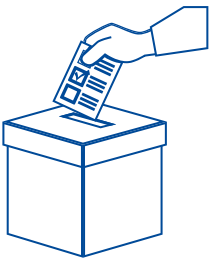

- Statewide filing deadline
 - March 18, 2022
- Municipal Filing Deadline
 - March 25, 2022
- State and Federal substitution deadline
 - August 24, 2022

General Election Rules



Uncontested Elections

- Uncontested elections are not canceled

Write In

- Candidates do not need to file

Replacement Candidates

- Replacement candidates allowed
 - Political parties must appoint replacement candidates to fill vacancies at the state and federal level by August 24, 2022

Winning

- Plurality required
- No primary runoffs

Primary Election Rules



Uncontested Elections

- Uncontested primaries are not cancelled

Official Political Parties

- Recognized parties:
 - Democratic, Republican

Write In

- Write-in candidates do not need to file

Winning

- Plurality required
- No outright win
- No primary runoffs

Local Rules



- All odd-numbered districts are up for election without being subject to change.
- Even-numbered districts are on the ballot as necessary due to redistricting.
- Incumbents had until Feb. 2 to file a statement of residency with the state elections department, which then determines which districts are holdovers (two incumbents in one district or no incumbents in a district).
