DESCRIPTIVE TITLE ESTABLISHING MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR./CIVIL RIGHTS DAY AS A PAID STATE HOLIDAY ON THE THIRD MONDAY OF JANUARY.

A "yes" vote shall have the effect of creating a paid state holiday known as Martin Luther King, Jr./Civil Rights Day.

A "no" vote shall have the effect of retaining the existing paid state holidays.
