F. THE 1990 CAPITAL PROJECTS GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND ACT authorizes the issuance and sale of Senior Citizens' Facilities Bonds. Shall the State of New Mexico be authorized to issue general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed one million nine hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$1,925,000) to make capital expenditures for certain senior citizens' facilities and equipment, and provide for a general property tax imposition and levy for payment of principal of and interest on the bonds and expenses for the collection of the tax, as permitted by law?
