Below is a model of the Detailed Outline. This is only an example of the first paragraph be sure to outline a minimum of three paragraphs.

Body Paragraph I:

Sub-Claim: Write out the actual sub-claim. Your sub-claim must introduce all evidence in paragraph and prove your central claim.

Evidence: You must have **at least three pieces of evidence** in each paragraph.

- a. Provide a specific piece of evidence – type out the actual piece of evidence and include a properly formatted Chicago footnote that identifies where your evidence came from.

Reasoning: Your reasoning needs to be in sentence format and explain how the evidence support your sub-claim and prove your central claim.

Follow the above format for the remaining body paragraphs. You need at least three (3).

Conclusion:

In a 3-4 sentence paragraph synthesize (bring together) your reasoning for why your person/event/legislation/court case has significantly promoted greater equality for your group. The conclusion is last part of the outline, end with argumentative and convincing language.

Reminders:

- Remember “evidence” appears in a variety of forms. You should include claims, facts, statistics and quotes from primary and secondary sources.
- Think about how you vary and integrate your sources. The expectation for this outline is that you are making use of **at least** three different sources- one book, one scholarly journal and another of your choosing. Remember this is the minimum!
