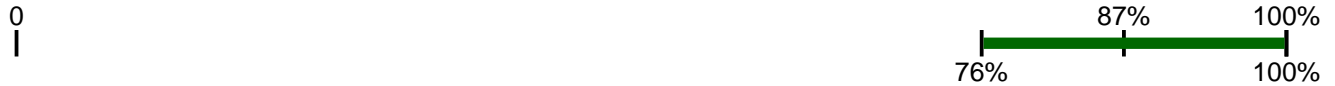
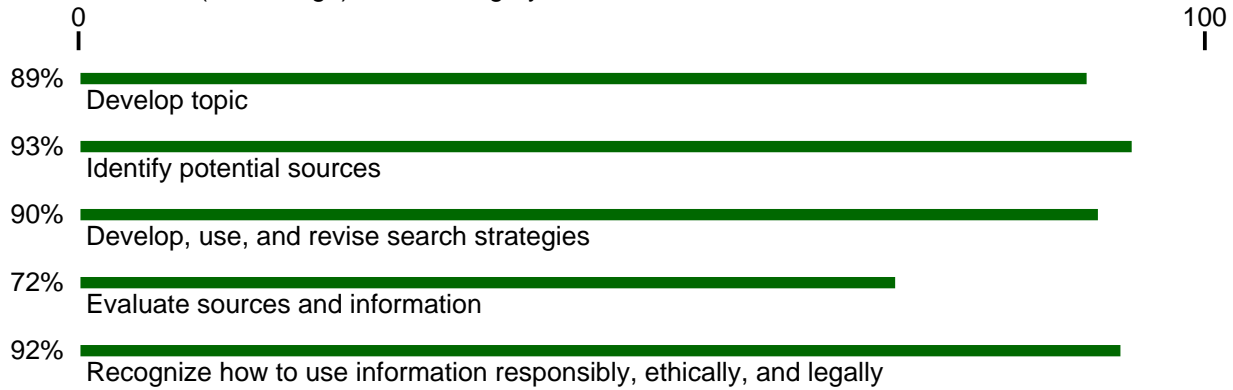

\* Each *single-correct-response* item (question) is worth one point. Each **response** of a *multiple-correct-response* item is worth one point, because **not** checking a wrong (distractor) response is worth as much as checking a correct response. E.g., a score of zero to five is possible from a five-response, multiple-correct-response item.

This means that half of all smokers will eventually die as a result of their smoking. If current smoking trends persist, nearly 9% of the world's population will eventually die as a result of tobacco.

**Author #2**

Many people still do not believe smoking causes serious health risks. In addition to respiratory illnesses, secondhand smoke causes 3,000 cancer fatalities each year. If people continue to smoke at the current rate, a huge number of these smokers will bring about their own death. At least five out of every ten will die. [CHOOSE ONE ANSWER]
