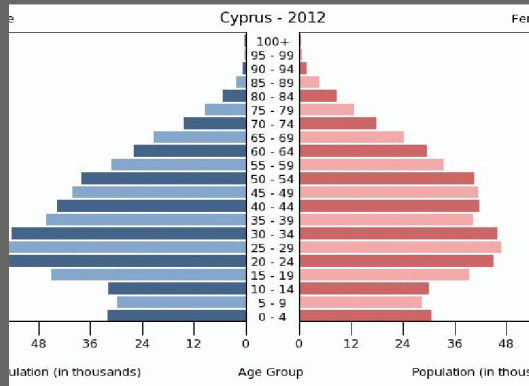
Cyprus' Economy
