Education	Up to 16	Based on # of years education
Specific Job Training	Up to 18	Based on # of years training
Job Experience	Up to 8	No experience means auto refusal
Occupation	Up to 10	Based on demand for skills
Job Offer	Up to 10	Points if immigrant has job waiting
Demographic Factor	Up to 8	Times of unemployment, gov't will reward few points here
Age	Up to 10	Aged 21-44 get 10 points. 2 points deducted for each year over or under
Knowledge of French and English	Up to 15	
Personal sustainability	Up to 10	Awarded as a result of an interview with immigration official
Bonus for assistance from close relatives	5	Close relative that will help with the move to Canada
