

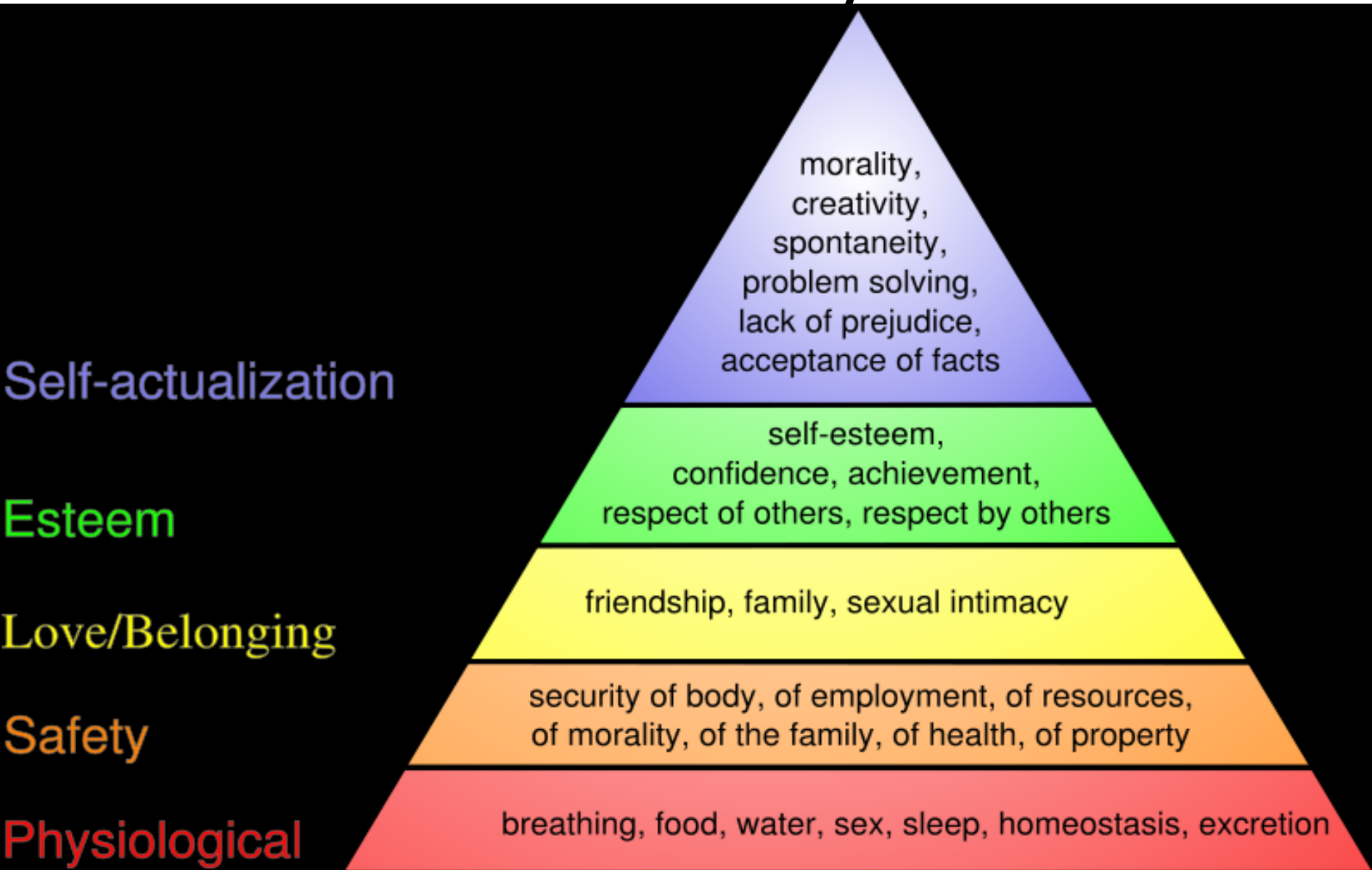

Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs

- When we have satisfied the need at one level, rather than becoming satisfied overall, we tend to move on and try to satisfy the need at the next level.
- Self-Actualization: people who are able to dedicate themselves to serving others

- They believe that all humans share common bonds.
