- Young women could now choose careers/child birth
  - Suburban Culture became the norm
  - Much of the music focused on protests and rebellion
  - When the “boom” went to school authoritarian education fell and progressive education was the norm
  - Led to car cultures, drive thru and shopping plaza’s
  - Hippies
  - Drugs
  - The Beatles
  - The Doors
  - The Who
  - War shacks were created outside urban areas
  - Technology played an important part in the revolution with the ‘pill’ which lead to a collapse of the boom
  - Freer attitudes towards sex and drugs were common
  - Spoiled brats to past generations
  - More couples were living together instead of marriage
  - More people were engaging in pre marital sex
  - The homes had driveways because a car was a necessity to get to the city
  - Very visible and highly vocal
  - Hendrix
  - Grateful Dead
  - Two age groups dominated suburbia: children under 15 and adults age 25-44
  - Make love not war
  - Over half of the population wasn’t yet legal adults
  - 1960’s brought the sexual revolution
  - Strongly influenced by tv and the media
  - Environmental Issues
  - Were considered rude and their music was too loud
  - They were considered a counterculture
  - Boomers transformed society in the 1960’s
