Several students from Broadford Christian Academy




and from Grace Academy attended the fair. Students from Heritage Academy and Sholom Christian were also among the attendees.

The top ten most anticipated majors for MU are: 1. PGA Golf Management. 2. Biol-





Countless people have claimed to be a god. So, how is Jesus any different?




