

# AIMS AT PARLOR REDS.

## Bill to Curb Them Calls for Simplifying Penal Statutes.

ALBANY, Jan. 14.—A concurrent resolution aimed to curb the activities of "parlor Socialists" was introduced in the Legislature today by Senator Black, Democrat, Brooklyn. The resolution recites that a patent argument of agitators is a comparison of the legal statutes as they apply to rich and poor violators. The appointment of a legislative committee to investigate the criminal courts, code of criminal procedure and the penal system of the State and to report recommendations for simplification of the penal statutes to the -921 Legislature is asked.

Increases in salaries for the State Police were asked in a bill introduced by Senator Walton, Republican, Ulster. The salary of the Deputy Superintendent would be increased from \$2,500 to \$3,000; captains from \$1,800 to \$2,400; lieutenants from \$1,500 to \$1,800 and privates \$60 a year.

A bill designed to make Good Friday a legal holiday was introduced by Assemblyman J. Fairfax McLaughlin, Democrats, of The Bronx.
