

WAVES PASS IN REVIEW

3,500 Parade in Celebration of Navy Day in the Bronx

Thirty-five hundred Waves in training at the "U.S.S. Hunter" were reviewed by Vice Admiral Adolphus Andrews, retired, former commander of the Eastern Sea Frontier, in special Navy Day celebrations held at 3 P. M. yesterday at the Women's Reserve Naval Training School at the Hunter College in the Bronx. Accompanying Vice Admiral Andrews, who previously had been piped aboard the training school by a Wave boat-swain's mate, were Capt. William F. Amsden, commanding officer, and Mrs. Robert Weeks Kelley, chairman of the National Women's Council, Navy League of the United States, the official sponsor of Navy Day.

Held in the Eighth Regiment Armory because of cold weather, the regimental review was observed by a newly arrived regiment still wearing civilian clothes except for Wave hats, shoes and stockings. These "boots" watched from the balcony as the uniformed women "trooped the line."
