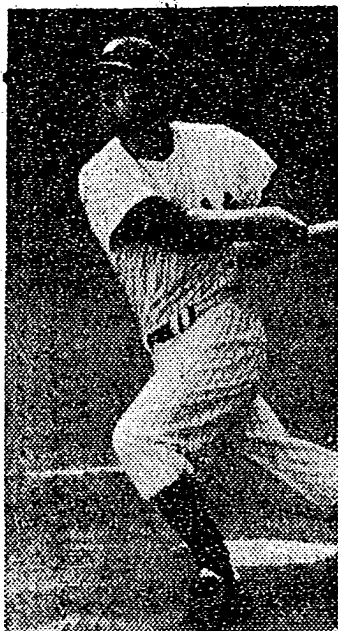


Yanks Win 3d Game, 10-0; Penn State Defeats Army

The Yankees again crushed the Pirates, 10—0, before 70,001 spectators at the Stadium yesterday to take a 2-1 lead in games in the world series. The New Yorkers got seven of their sixteen hits in the first inning, when they routed two pitchers and scored six runs.

Bobby Richardson's home run with the bases full capped the big inning. Richardson also batted in two Yanks with a single in the four-run fourth. His total of six broke the world series record of five runs batted in that had been equaled by Mickey Mantle in the second game.

Whitey Ford became the first pitcher in the series to go the full nine innings. The left-hander restricted Pittsburgh to four hits and walked only one batter while striking out three. This was his sixth world series victory against four defeats. Mantle hit his third home run of the series and his second against Fred Green. The switch hitter has struck all three batting right-handed against left-handed pitching. His home-run total in world series competition rose to fourteen, only one behind Babe Ruth's record.
