

# **700 WAVES, 160 SPARS WILL BE GRADUATED**

## ***First Class Trained at Hunter Completes Course Tuesday***

The new Naval Training School, Women's Reserve, the Bronx, which took over the facilities of Hunter College last month and received its first "boots" Feb. 14, will turn out its first class of Waves and Spars next Tuesday, the Third Naval District announced yesterday.

The first group will comprise some 700 Waves and 160 Spars, completing preliminary training.

All are in the yeoman classification and 800 of them will be sent to advanced yeoman training school. About 65, however, chosen for special experience, will be rated yeomen third class and sent direct to active duty in naval establishments.

Of those being graduated Tuesday, 400 Waves will go to Georgia State College for Women at Milledgeville, Ga., and 240 Waves and 160 Spars to Oklahoma Agricultural and Mechanical College at Stillwater, Okla.

Others of the 2,000 in the first class will be sent to specialized schools in about a week. Beginning March 24 the school will admit its third class.

Half of the Waves and Spars of the first Hunter contingent yesterday received their first opportunity to visit New York City since they entered the Navy. Clad in their new blue uniforms, 1,000 of them enjoyed shore liberty during the afternoon. The other 1,000 will have the same privilege today.
