

BRONX SOCIALISTS TO GO WITH OTHERS

ALBANY, Mar. 1.—Unless they take the witness stand and repudiate objectionable doctrines of their party, Assemblymen Samuel Orr and Samuel A. DeWitt, of the Bronx, two of the five Socialist Assemblymen under fire, will be expelled with the rest of their Socialist confederates in the Assembly, according to a member of the Assembly Judiciary Committee, who is in almost daily conference with Speaker Sweet.

Against Assemblymen August Claessens and Louis Waldman, of Manhattan and Charles Solomon, of Kings, Speaker Sweet and his lieutenants feel that ample evidence growing out of their public utterances and acts has been presented to justify their removal from office. No personal charges, however, have been made against the two Socialist Assemblymen from the Bronx. Assemblyman DeWitt was elected for the first time last November, and had not occupied his seat in the Assembly more than half an hour when the vote to suspend the Socialists was taken.
