

TO SELL INFANT ASYLUM.

Jewish Institution In the Bronx to Move to a New Building.

The Hebrew Infant Asylum of the City of New York obtained permission yesterday from Supreme Court Justice Blanchard to sell its property at Eagle Avenue and 161st Street, the Bronx, to Henry Fischel for \$35,000. The sale will not include the office furniture, nor the milk sterilizing apparatus of the institution.

Benno Neuberger, President of the asylum, recited in his application for judicial approval of the sale that the asylum is building a new institution on its property on the Kingsbridge Road, the Bronx. The new structure will cost \$310,000. The asylum now accommodates 153 children. There have been opportunities to care for 300 deserving cases, for which the asylum had no room.

There is a mortgage for \$125,000 on the property, \$66,000 has already been subscribed to the building fund, and there are prospects of raising an additional \$100,000 by subscription, said President Neuberger. Some 2,000 members annually contribute \$20,000 to the current expenses of the asylum.

FINE NEW AUTOMOBILE CLUB.

A. C. A. Will Mortgage Its Property and Build a New Home.

The Automobile Club of America obtained permission yesterday from Supreme Court Justice Blanchard to mortgage its property, 242 to 250 West Fifty-fifth Street, near Eighth Avenue, for \$400,000. Of this amount \$100,000 will be used to pay off a previous mortgage and the remainder for a luxurious clubhouse. The application was made through Henry Sanderson, President of the club.

The land on which the clubhouse will be erected cost \$183,833. The proposed clubhouse and its equipment will cost, it is estimated, \$580,000. The mortgage will be used to protect bonds which will be sold to members of the club.
