1. Little Old New York, in the era of 1850—horse-drawn street cars and all. Hop on an authentic old tug boat for an exciting ride in the harbor.

2. Visit through old New England in your dashing 1909 Caddie. See the fishing villages and whaling ports.

3. Tour the Great Lakes in a great stern-wheeler... the last two to be built in the U. S. will be on float in the Lakes.

4. See Chicago burn down! Help the old Chicago fire department put out the great blaze started by Mrs. O'Leary's cow.

5. Visit the Cavalry Stockade and watch the pony express riders leave on their journeys just as they did exactly 100 years ago.

6. Join the old fur trappers as they sought their prey up through the Northwest Passage. You'll be attacked by Indians as you ride your bull boat but, without fail, you escape unharmed.

7. Stroll through San Francisco's Chinatown, wander along the Barbary Coast and watch the city crumble around you as it did in the period of the great "quake."

8. Enjoy a visit with the miners in the old Southwest. Ride in an ore-bucket across the U. S. to the north high over the Rockies.

9. See the Old South in the days of the Civil War. You'll ride through cross-fire between the Blue and the Gray as shells narrowly miss your "correspondent's wagon."

10. Thrill to the fun and excitement of the Mardi Gras in New Orleans. Ride the amazing dragon, Danny, as he weaves his way through the crowds blowing smoke and fire as he passes.

11. Zoom around two continents in a rocket ship in Satellite City, our nation's city of the future.

12. Take a "transcontinental" ride around the U. S. A. in a real steam-powered Iron Horse.
