

WAVES, SPARS GET PAID

**Women at Hunter for Their 'Boot'
Training Receive \$20 Each**

Two thousand Waves and Spars assigned to the "boot" school at Hunter College, the Bronx, received their first pay envelopes yesterday in the lounge room on the third deck of the student hall. At the rate of \$50 a month, the pay amounted to \$20 each, as the Waves and Spars have been in service less than a half month. Many of the women bought \$25 war bonds for \$18.75 and virtually all bought stamps in varying amounts at a table near the paymaster's table. The paymaster was Lieutenant (j. g.) George H. Thompson.

The Waves and Spars were not in uniform, their Navy apparel not having been received as yet. All wore identification tags on their civilian coats.
