

# 4 STAFF AIDES HERE FOR WAVES SCHOOL

**First Prospective Faculty  
Members Arrive to Assist  
Set-Up of Hunter Unit**

**TOTAL OF 145 EXPECTED**

**Three Are Experienced in Work  
With Girls and the Fourth  
Was an Attorney**

Dealing with large groups of women should present no difficulties to the first four Waves officers assigned to organize the training school for Waves and Spars on the Bronx campus of Hunter College. In civilian life three of them supervised girls in academic institutions, while the fourth, a lawyer, spent three years untangling civil cases for both men and women.

Armed with at least one college degree each, Lieutenant Violet Boynton, Ensigns Helen Knox, Isabelle Wadsworth and Frances McCloud arrived in the Bronx last week to assist in organizing the newest and largest naval training school for women, under the direction of Captain William F. Amsden, commander of the school. A total staff of 145 Wave officers has been requested, and some are expected to arrive at the beginning of next week.

With the exception of Lieutenant Boynton, the officers expect definite assignments on the faculty. Lieutenant Boynton, who will be in charge of physical education, has been training teachers in that field since 1926.

As aide to Captain Amsden, Ensign Frances McCloud makes use of her experience in dealing with people in general and the Navy in particular. She was social director at Cornell University, where she was in charge of all student festivities, including recreation work with the navy. Ensign McCloud went to Officers Training School at Smith College in August, was adjutant to the battalion commander, and came to New York via Washington. Her home town is Denton, Texas.

Another Texan is Ensign Helen Knox, who practiced law in Dallas for three years. At Smith College Officers Training School she taught law for three months.

Joining the Navy is still a good way to see the world, according to Ensign Isabelle Wadsworth, on leave from her position as dean of girls at Beverly Hills High School in California. Ensign Wadsworth's husband, Guy W. Wadsworth Jr., is a major in the Army.
