

# **HUNTER TO RESUME CLASSES IN BRONX**

Hunter College students will attend classes at the Bronx buildings of the institution, Bedford and Navy Avenues, tomorrow for the first time since 1943, it was announced yesterday.

Official opening ceremonies at those structures will be held Wednesday at 2:30 P. M. Mayor O'Dwyer and Bronx Borough President. James J. Lyons have been invited to the traditional flag-raising exercises. Dr. George N. Shuster, Hunter president, will speak.

The Bronx buildings, opened in 1931, were used by the Navy during the war as a training station for Waves and Spars and thus 2,500 students were transferred to the Park Avenue and Sixty-eighth Street building in Manhattan. The Bronx campus was used recently as the temporary headquarters for the United Nations, but extensive alterations were necessary to convert the structure for academic purposes.

According to a spokesman, 750 lower freshmen will attend courses in the Bronx between 8:40 A. M. and 2 P. M. A special session will be held for 500 veterans from 2:30 to 7 P. M. Student activities will be limited to the student hall for this semester, it was said, and one of the two lunch rooms there will serve as a book room.
