

# Stengel Again Hints He'll Retire

PITTSBURGH, Oct. 12 (AP)—Casey Stengel hinted broadly today that he would resign as manager of the Yankees after the world series.

Stengel's retirement has been rumored for some time.

The 70-year-old Stengel, expounding in the clubhouse after the New York victory today, took time out to thank the writers. Before the game thirty-five members of the New York Chapter of the Baseball Writers Association of America had presented a petition to Stengel asking him to remain as manager as long as his health permitted.

"It was wonderful of them writers," he said. "But I've been here twelve years and when a feller stays so long in one place he gets a lot of people mad at him and he gets mad at a lot of people when they blame him for blowing the tight games."

Reports persist that Stengel has not forgiven the front office for laying the blame of last year's pennant loss at his door.
