

# TENANTS GET BACK \$30,000

---

## Rebates Made During Year by Two Cooperative Houses Here

---

New savings for more than 800 New York families occupying two large apartment houses under the cooperative tenancy plan were reported yesterday by the Cooperative League of the United States.

In the Amalgamated Housing Corporation's building facing Van Cortlandt Park, in the Bronx, and Grand Street model tenements of Amalgamated Dwellings, Inc., both of which are under supervision of the State Board of Housing and are under the same management, savings equal to about \$30,000 in rent have been made during the past fiscal year, and have taken the form of rebates, the league reported.

The Bronx apartment project has just completed the installation of an electric generating plant at a cost of \$75,000, which the league estimates will cut the electric bills of the tenant-members by \$15,000 to \$20,000 a year.
