Enlistment of 1,200 Women in
Navy and Coast Guard
Sought by March 1

A CEREMONY AT HUNTER

New Reserve Naval Training
School to Be Commissioned
on the Bronx Campus

A drive by the Third Naval District to enlist 1,200 women in the Navy and Coast Guard auxiliaries by March 1 will be opened on Waves and Spars Day tomorrow in connection with the commissioning of the new Women's Reserve Naval Training School on the Bronx campus of Hunter College.

The ceremonies will start at noon at City Hall, where 350 inductees into the Waves and Spars will be sworn in by Rear Admiral Randal Jacobs, U. S. N., chief of Naval Personnel, and Rear Admiral Stanley V. Parker, U. S. C. G., District Coast Guard Officer.

Other speakers at the City Hall ceremonies will include Mayor La Guardia, Lieutenant Commander Mildred McAfee, U. S. N. R., director of the Waves, Lieutenant Commander Dorothy Stratton, U. S. C. G. R., director of the Spars, and Captain Kenneth G. Castleman, U. S. N., director of the Office of Naval Officer Procurement. Lieutenant John D. Lodge, U. S. N. R.,

master of ceremonies, will interview a hero from a combat zone at 12:25 P. M.

A special subway train will take the inductees to Hunter College's Bronx campus, where the commissioning ceremonies of the naval training school will start at 3:30 P. M.
