Scrolling Down on a Web Page

Scrolling is when the user moves down a web page horizontally and vertically to read content that is not initially seen. Scrolling down on a web page does not change the information content nor change the layout of the images and text. The scroll bar looks like this:



To scroll, you can either use your mouse and left click on the arrow or you can either hold the left part of the mouse down and drag the bar to the preferred location.

Refreshing a Web Page

Refreshing a web page is done when:

- The content on the page did not fully load properly (missing images or information)
- Using a website (e.x: eBay) when information can change quickly



Going Back and Forth through Web Pages

On all Internet Browsers you have the option of going backwards or forwards through your previous searches when the browser was open. Simply, left click on the arrow to go backwards or forwards.



Bookmarking Favorite Web Pages

Saving a website in your Internet Browser is the same on every browser. Mozilla FireFox calls it a “bookmark” and Internet Explorer calls it a “favorite.” Simply, left click on “bookmark” or “favorite” than select, “bookmark this page” or “add to favorites.” Fill in the name you want the website to be saved as and click “add.”



Adding Tabs

Tabs allow the user to browse several website in the same Internet browser without having to open up multiple Internet browsers. To make an extra tab,

- (1) Left click on “file”
- (2) Left click on “new tab”

To open up a tab, left click on the title of the tab. To delete a tab, left click on the 'X'
