Vocabulary

Vocabulary is critical to reading because it supports comprehension and communication.

High Frequency Words for this week are: care, father, interesting, sweat, thumb, touch

Robust Vocabulary Words for this week are: dappled, entranced, trooped, circling, adorable, assortment, habitat, immense

Quick Tip: To expose your child to these words, one suggestion may include placing word cards around the house and having the student read and define the words as they find them.

In our literacy centers, we place the words on index cards with the definitions on the back. The students read the cards and work with partners to become more familiar with the words.

Writing: (Writing complete sentences)

We will write paragraphs about various pictures. Writing Trait: (Ideas) Conventions (using the correct grammar, punctuation, and spelling). We will also work on describing. The students will also work on using effective word choices in their writing-such as rhyming words and colorful words to clarify description and revise word choices. Bullying Contract: I promise I will not bully others. I promise I will not hurt others through my words or my actions. I promise to be kind. Be Safe. Be ready to learn!

Read Aloud Charts

"Macaw" – (describing how we listen for a purpose) Students will discuss what they enjoyed most about the poem.

"Be Kind to Animals" – Students will think about what is happening in the poem and the feeling they get from it.

Listening Center

Stories: "Rain Forest Babies" By Kathy Darling

Genre: Non-Fiction

While listening to these stories, the students will learn new vocabulary words: interesting, thumb, father, touch, care, sweat. The students will also orally discuss the beginning, middle, and end of the story & the author's message. They will also learn about story structure.
