eInstruction is a Classroom Performance System (CPS) that you can use in your classroom to inspire and engage students. Use the real-time, interactive wireless response pad technology to obtain immediate feedback from every student.

In the Classroom

Gain feedback from students in your classroom by combining eInstruction's Classroom Performance System with presentations containing *unitedstreaming* digital media such as videos, images and animations. Use the CPS to:

- Pose questions to students during a presentation
- Modify your lessons based on student response to questions
- Create question-oriented games and other interactive activities
- Provide a non-threatening environment where students feel comfortable participating


Combine *unitedstreaming* content with PowerPoint and eInstruction

Step 1 Search for *unitedstreaming* videos, animations and images and download content to a designated folder on your computer.

Step 2 Open an existing PowerPoint presentation or create a new one. Save it in the same folder location as your *unitedstreaming* animation, video, and image files.

Step 3 Develop your PowerPoint presentation and insert *unitedstreaming* videos, images and animations (see additional "*unitedstreaming* in Action" files for instructions on creating hyperlinks and embedding videos in PowerPoint).

Step 4 Use the CPS to ask questions during your PowerPoint presentation. You can run both the PowerPoint file and the CPS simultaneously. Use a projector to display your PowerPoint slides and the CPS Verbal Questions taskbar will be projected along with your presentation. From this taskbar you can ask a verbal question in any one of six question types and students use their response pads to record their answer.



The CPS taskbar allows you to ask a verbal question in six different question types. Students use their response pads to record their answer.
