



Real World Design Challenge

The Real World Design Challenge is an annual high school competition run by a public-private partnership with the goal of sustainably increasing the Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) workforce. Teams of 3-7 secondary school students design a plane looking at the forces of flight, lift, weight, thrust & drag with the goal of enhancing performance and fuel efficiency. Each team is supported by professional mentors.

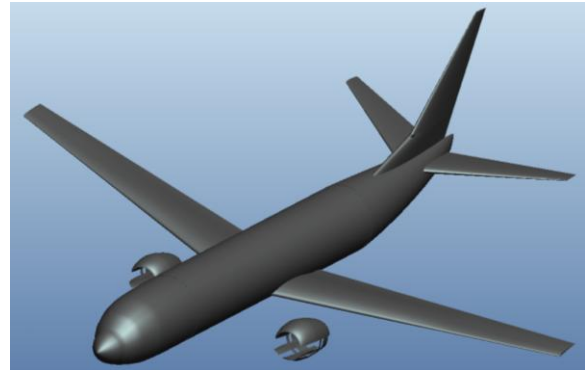

The Challenge is *free* to teachers and students. *Each teacher gets \$1 million in professional engineering software and teams get access to professional mentors.* Twenty-five governors

have supported the “Governor’s Challenge” at the state level. The national competition is held each year in Washington, DC.

Numerous designers, mentors, and judges from across industry, government, and academia have been key to the success of the program by donating their expertise to design the Challenge, share their knowledge with students, and evaluate the students work.

The Challenge is “Real World” in the following ways:

- (1) ***Real Problem:*** An Industry defined problem provides a practical application of classroom curricula;
- (2) ***Real tools & Resources:*** Inspire students by showing them what is at their fingertips;
- (3) ***Real Roles for Students:*** Require teamwork, leaderships, Innovation & problem solving skills;
- (4) ***Real Contribution:*** Students can make a difference, solving industry-based problems.
