GLOBAL POPULISM:

ORIGINS, PRACTICES, & COUNTER-STRATEGIES

From Brexit to Trump candidacy, to Russian and Chinese agitprop, resurgent populism is one of the leading ideologies across the globe. While many dismiss it as a passing fad, populism carries multifaceted implications for global political processes. In order to effectively engage populist movements, it is important to unpack its origins, as well as to conceive of counter-strategies for global media and policy communities. This event, timed the day before the US Presidential Elections, will unpack global populism through a comparative panel of experts speaking about Europe, United States, China, Russia and Latin America. We'll explore the mythologies of populism and its roots, manifestations, global features and cultural specificities, as well as the linkages between the media and growing populist unrest.
