

ENDING “ED” WORD SORT

1. Read all the words to the students and segment all the sounds.
2. Underline the letters that make the sound before the ending “ed.” For example: jumped, checked
3. Cut the words apart.
4. Sort the words into two piles: words with blends and words without.
5. Sort words by the ending sound in each word: /d/, /t/, /id/. (3 piles)
6. How do we know when “ed” makes these sounds in words? (“ed” sounds like /d/ when the next to last sound is voiced; “ed” sound like /t/ when the next to last sound is unvoiced; “ed” sounds like /id/ when the next to last sound is /t/ or /d/.
