

Quizlet – Free Online Flashcard Tool

Help improve student learning with <http://quizlet.com> a free website which utilizes flash cards and interactive memory games to help students learn. Users can easily create flashcard sets and teachers have rights to create learning groups providing additional tools. The application provides five modes: familiarize, learn, test, scatter, and space race. No login is required to get started.

They can begin with one of thousands of different available quizzes or use a set you have created. Students can work individually or within a group. Terms can be shared, reviewed online, or printed for offline use.

Why do teachers like Quizlet?

1. It helps students study faster and more effectively.
2. After Quizlet flash cards are created, it's easy for a teacher to help students who are struggling by having them review with the online tools. These tools can be useful for teacher-led whole class review as well.
3. Quizlet lets teachers know which words the students are frequently getting wrong.

Quizlet Basics – Using Other's Flash Cards

Search for Flash Card Sets created by other users

1. **Find Flashcards** – brings up the subject screen. Click on a subject to see a listing of flashcard sets. Quizlet is used for language instruction by schools around the world so you will find an abundance of language flashcard sets.
2. When you go into a subject area, all the flashcard sets in that subject area are listed. Look at the title and the number of terms in each set. If you find a set you'd like to explore, just click on it. You can also click on an author to see the flashcard sets they have created.


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Five Learning Modes

1. **Familiarize Mode** gives you a taste of the material before diving in.
2. **Learn Mode** is the most powerful study mode, keeping track of your scores, retesting incorrect answers, and letting you pause and resume study sessions.
3. **Test Mode** is the most versatile study mode, supporting short-answer, matching, multiple choice and true/false testing, or any combination. It also scores your answers with easy-to-read corrections.
4. **Scatter** is a fun matching game which lets you drag and drop questions and answers with your mouse while racing against the clock.
5. **Space Race** is the ultimate video game study simulation. Racing the clock, you type in answers to questions flying overhead before they evade your grasp.

Quizlet Intermediate – Create Your Own Flash Card Set

1. Create an account. You must go into your email to confirm before you can begin using it.
2. Fill in the information requested.
3. Enter the terms and definition. Future versions will allow the uploading of images. Currently you can use images, but only from Flickr and you must search for the image using a tag word it was filed under.
4. Decide if you will allow everyone to view the set and if you want to allow anyone to edit the set. Both of these can be set so a password is required.
5. Decide if you will allow set discussion or not.
6. You are given a unique URL – Tinylink.
